### **TAX LAW: Claiming Adult Dependents, Feb. 21**

Are you supporting an adult child or parent? Your son lost his job and just moved back home with you. Your daughter is getting a divorce and she and the kids will be living with you until she can get back on her feet. Are you making all the payments for your mother who is living in an assisted living facility? Or, Mom may still be living in her own home, but you and your siblings are paying all her expenses. The big tax question is: Can you claim an exemption for any of them on your own personal tax return?

Villager Marcia Bailey, a former Internal Revenue Agent and Educational Outreach Coordinator for the IRS, will discuss the tax law requirements for claiming an exemption. Come learn how you may be able to lower your tax liability and claim an exemption for your adult son, daughter, or parent.

### **LIVING WELL WITH DIABETES. An evidence-based program developed by Stanford University. March 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, and April 6, 1-3 p.m., in the Kahite Annex**

Certified Diabetes Educator Jane Kelly RN leads other health professionals from the University of Tennessee Medical Center for this six-week workshop in diabetes management.

This class was such a great hit when we did it in the fall, we are doing it again!

Tellico Village University is collaborating with the University of Tennessee Education Program to bring a vital workshop to our residents. If you have diabetes, live with someone who has diabetes, or had your doctor inform you that you are pre-diabetic, you really need to attend these free sessions. Subjects covered include: 1) techniques to deal with the symptoms of diabetes, fatigue, pain, hyper/hypoglycemia, stress, and emotional problems such as depression, anger, fear, and frustration; 2) appropriate exercise for maintaining and improving strength and endurance; 3) healthy eating 4) appropriate use of medication; and 5) working more effectively with healthcare providers. Participants will make weekly action plans, share experiences, and help each other solve problems they encounter in creating and carrying out their self-management program. Physicians, diabetes educators, dietitians, and other health professionals both at Stanford and in the community have reviewed all materials in the workshop.

Each participant in the workshop receives a copy of the companion book, *Living a Healthy Life with Chronic Conditions, 4th Edition*, and an audio relaxation tape, provided free through a generous grant awarded to the Knox County Extension Agency). Worth your attendance alone!

This workshop is based on the work done by the Stanford Patient Education Research that saw that participants who completed the six week workshop series showed significant improvements in management of depression, symptoms of hypoglycemia, communication with physicians, healthy eating, and reading and using food labels. They also had significant improvements in patient activation and self-efficacy.

This course is free to all Tellico Village residents and our neighbors in the surrounding area. Registration is required through our website. A confirmation will be sent.

### **WORLD GEOGRAPHY: Humans and Their Environment, March 20**

Let's start at the beginning. This first course in world geography will help us appreciate the traditions that collectively make up geography, and allow us to explore a number of ways in which the discipline has relevance in the contemporary world. This course sets the stage for further study of geography through Tellico Village University.

If you are a naturally curious person who wonders about the myriad relationships that exist between human beings and their environment, this course is for you. Some of the possible issues discussed in this class include geographic learning as an antidote to isolationism/provincialism in an increasing globalizing world; how a better understanding of Middle Eastern geography might have altered United States foreign policy; and which is dominant – human beings or their environment

And the best part, to teach this course, we discovered a highly qualified and seasoned college professor just up the street. Villager Sam Sheldon Ph.D. earned his doctorate in geography from Louisiana State University. His study of world geography has taken him to the classroom of many colleges and universities, including teaching on a voyage for Semester at Sea. He is anxious to share his experiences and insights with our Tellico Village neighbors.

This course is his introductory course in geography. We hope Sam will continue to share his expertise with additional short courses later this year.

## **Divorce resulted in Gotham becoming homeless**

Gotham is just over one year old, is calm, and leash trained. He is a medium-sized Terrier/American Pit Bull mix. People are surprised to learn when brought up and socialized dogs with Gotham's breeding are dependable, good natured, loyal companions. He is neutered, has his vaccinations, and is ready for the right human to take him home.

Humans who will do well with Gotham are ones who are willing to spend time with him. Because of his young age and breeding, they should be willing to exercise him on a leash each day, and more importantly give him the attention he craves and deserves. He will do best in a home where he is not routinely left alone for long periods of time and that has at least one human who is not a novice dog owner. When you adopt a dog make sure it is right for the circumstance. For example, a large or high energy dog may not be best suited for you a senior. A miniature breed may not be best for a family with active children. Take the time to socialize a bit with the dog you think is the one for you by walking it on a leash, taking him to a fenced in compound so it can run and play with you. You will learn a lot about the pooch if you do this. Also, and determine how much if any training it may or may not have. If the dog needs training make sure you have the time and resources to train it, or your relationship with your new best friend may quickly end.

Great week for adoptions! There were 30 adoptions, took in 32 animals this week, returned one to its owner, and transferred 14 dogs to rescue.
