LUB Substation Update

As you can see from the drone photo, steel is in the air. The schedule is not yet precisely determined, but the transformers should move in sometime in the week of April 3. The following week, the control room should move in. The week after that, the transformers get “dressed” – that is, install their bushings, radiators and undergo functional testing for their load tap changers (the device that regulates steady voltage). While all of this is going on, the foundation work will continue and the steel erection will be advancing right behind it. Wiring will soon follow and testing will take about 2 weeks to complete. Start-up date will likely be at the end of May, possibly the beginning of June. As the steel erection proceeds, the construction contractor will provide an updated schedule.

Bridge Update

In the next couple of weeks, there will be changes to traffic patterns near the intersection of Highways 444 and 321. On or about April 7, the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) will open one lane on the new bridge over the Tellico Canal (toward Maryville). The existing bridge over the canal will be open to one lane of traffic going toward Lenoir City. About a week later, the ramp that goes under the Tellico Canal bridges will be closed for about two months while the ramp is aligned with the new roadway, repaved and the sand baskets are removed. That closure means traffic coming from Maryville to Tellico Village will have to make a left turn from H321 on to H444. Traffic from H444 going to Lenoir City will have to make a left turn on to H321. The TDOT Liaison Committee will provide more information about these changes as we receive it from TDOT.

Around the first of April, we will see the TDOT contractor begin to pour concrete on the new Highway 321 Bridge. The pouring of the roadway will be followed by pouring the side barriers and asphalt paving of the road approaching the bridge from each direction. TDOT is still confident that the new bridge will be open to traffic by late spring or early summer this year, assuming minimal weather delays.
