Highlights from the Board Workshop

This month's POA Board Workshop occurred on April 4. The workshop covered the collections process, pavilion use and rules, streaming videos, and the By-Law notice. Here are the top highlights:

- **Five Star Independent Living** – Marti Hands gave a presentation about the background of Five Star Senior living, an overview of the Independent Living campus, and the amenities to be offered. She also gave an update as to where the project stands today. If you are interested in learning more, there will be an open meeting tonight, April 4, at 6:30 p.m. and tomorrow, April 5, at 9:30 a.m. Both of these meetings will be at The Neighborhood at Tellico Village (100 Chatuga Drive West, Loudon, 37774).
- **Pavilion Use & Rules** – Tom Lee briefly discussed an addition to the reservation form for Toqua Pavilion. On the reservation form, if a renter has outside alcohol catering, they must agree to provide a copy of the off-site catering license.
- **Collections** - Kendra Forsythe gave an overview of the collections process at Tellico Village. She also discussed the 2016 collections results by type. In addition to these topics, she also talked about the challenges and opportunities that the collections process faces. Pursuing out-of-state property owners has proven to be difficult; however, the Florida test was successful in 2016. A majority of property owners who are late in their payments are lot owners.
- **Streaming Videos** – Ray Wright and Beth Kuberka gave a report of the importance of streaming, specifically streaming POA, HOA, and other public meetings in real-time to everyone in the Village and property owners who live outside of the Village. The benefits of live broadcasts were discussed, as were the equipment needs. Cost details were also laid out.
- **By-Law Notice** – Kevin Stevens discussed the By-Law notice that will be sent to residents in the quarterly newsletter. The change addresses the possibility of adding term limits to Board positions.

Change to Traffic Pattern Announced

Beginning Friday April 7th, TDOT will keep open one lane of the ramp that goes under the Tellico Canal bridges. This means that traffic going from H444 to Lenoir City will continue to merge onto H321 as always. Traffic coming from Maryville to Tellico Village will have a turn lane to make a left turn from H321 on to H444. Plans remain unchanged for opening one lane on the new bridge over the Tellico Canal (toward Maryville) one lane on the existing bridge over the canal going toward Lenoir City.
