We continue to receive questions about the use of our three pavilions, so we hope that this will clear up any remaining confusion. Tellico Village has three pavilions available for use; they are the Kahite Pavilion, the Tugaloo Pavilion (also known as the "Beach Pavilion"), and the Toqua Pavilion.

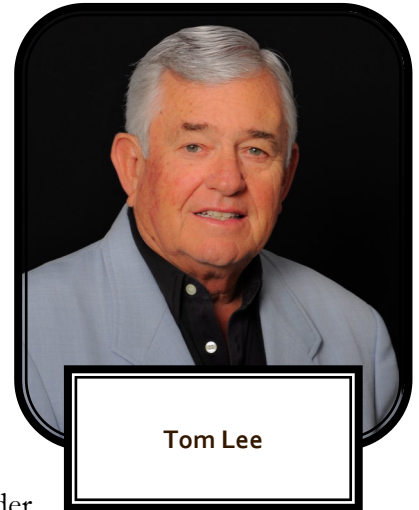
The Kahite Pavilion seats approximately 50 people. It has six tables under cover, electricity, water, a charcoal grill and a children's playground. The Tugaloo Pavilion seats approximately 100 people, with 16 picnic tables under cover, 3 grills, electricity, water, and, of course, a great beach.

The Toqua Pavilion seats approximately 150 people under cover, has tables and chairs, water, electricity, a large bar, a fireplace and a stage. A large propane grill is available for a small additional charge. Although there is a kitchen in this pavilion, it is not available for use due to the fact that the contractor (AWE Hospitality) has food, beverages and kitchen utensils stored in the kitchen area.

Pavilion General Rules are:

- Reservations may only be made by Tellico Village Property Owners, and must be made in advance.
- For the Kahite and Tugaloo pavilions, contact Larissa Lownsdale at the Chota Recreation Center, 865- 458-6779. For the Toqua Pavilion, contact the Yacht Club at 865-458-4363.
- Reservations must be made in advance and are on a first come, first serve basis.
- The Kahite and Tugaloo pavilions are \$50 per reservation. Toqua is \$75 per reservation.
- Outside caterers or the Yacht Club may be used for food and beverage service at all of the pavilions, but if the caterer is providing alcoholic beverages, they must provide a copy of their "Off Premise Alcohol License". "Pot Luck" style gatherings are permitted at all of the pavilions.

For other information and specific requirements, contact Larissa Lownsdale at the number above. We sincerely hope that you and your family, friends and neighbors take advantage of these facilities and enjoy them to the fullest.

Tellico Village Lions Now Collecting Used Plastic Pill Containers

As part of a nation-wide effort initiated by Lions Clubs International (LCI), the TV Lions are now collecting plastic pill containers. In many developing nations, when medications are dispensed, they are not placed in a container but rather the medication is handed to the patient or placed in a bag. This can lead to sanitation problems, as well as loss of the medications themselves. Having these used containers available for distribution of the medicine will enhance these programs considerably. They will be distributed by LCI using a network of NGO's and Health Care Providers in these developing nations. We are asking that TV residents who have used plastic containers to place them in the receptacles that the Lions have placed around the Village, instead of throwing them away. These receptacles can be found in the clubhouses, the Library, etc. The container should be clean and labels removed. Support for this new effort will be greatly appreciated by the Lions, as well as some individual in a distant country who will have a better way to secure their medication.

Pets of the Week: Meet Billie, Pewter, Pergo, Samson, Nubbin, and Noodles!

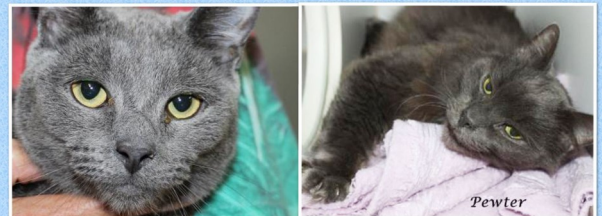
