### **Finance Advisory Committee Meeting Highlights**

- Director's Report - Parker Owen was out of the office so Kendra Forsythe gave the Director's Report. Kendra reported that she and Parker continue to work with board members to track and define long-term maintenance costs for the POA and its operating divisions. The Audit Committee met on May 10<sup>th</sup> to receive the draft report on the 2016 audited financial statements from TVPOA's audit firm, Coulter and Justus, P.C. We received an unqualified clean opinion from the auditors. There were no audit adjustments

during fieldwork procedures, meaning that there were no material mistakes or unreasonable estimates identified during the audit.

- Variance Report – Kendra reported that we have a huge favorable variance. Golf revenues were good for Jan/Feb/March. However, golf revenues were slightly less than expected in the month of April due to several rain events. Dock/RV – met month-to-date projections. Kendra also discussed several deferred projects for maintenance.
- The Quarterly Marketing Report was presented, along with the FAC Budget Review Chart, three capital project funding requests, and committee liaison reports.

Finance will also present at the Board Meeting next Wednesday, May 17.

## **A BIG THANK YOU!**

The recent property owners marketing survey experienced an outstanding response. The survey which closed on May 5 drew a response rate of 33.5 percent. There were 1,170 eligible households (those that purchased their first Tellico Village property - home or lot - between January 1, 2014 and March 1, 2017) and 391 households participated in the survey. With this level of participation, the TVPOA Marketing team has a statistically viable sample to complete a wide-range of data analysis. The team is scheduled to report the survey results at the June 21 TVPOA Board meeting.

## **TV LIONS HONOR ONE OF THEIR OWN – LARRY ELDER**

At a recent meeting, the Tellico Village Lions Club honored one of its most distinguished members by awarding Lion Larry Elder a Melvin Jones Fellowship. This is the most prestigious award a Lions Club can present to a member and it is reserved for those who provide extraordinary service to the club and the community. The fellowship is named after the founder of Lions Clubs in Chicago 100 years ago, Melvin Jones. Receiving the award in this, the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year of Lions, is particularly significant. Clubs normally only nominate one person a year for the award. The actual decision for the award is made by the headquarters of Lions Clubs International in Illinois and is based on the contributions to the club and its community made by the nominee. Lion Elder has been a Lion for 44 years. He first became in Lion when he lived in Clarion, PA. While a member of that club he served in every officer position up to and including President. He also served on the Lions District governing committee as a member of the Governor's Board. He was also very active in the local community. He was elected to the Clarion School Board at the age of 26. For the service to that community he was named Citizen of the Year by its Chamber of Commerce in 1979. After moving to Tellico Village, he joined the TV Lions in which he has served as Membership Chairman as well as a Director and Vice President. Most importantly in the Lions club, he has served as the Lead Lion (manager) of the annual Golf-for-Sight Outing the club holds every year in May. This is the club's primary fund raiser and under his direction the amount of funds raised has almost doubled to where it is anticipated that this year (the outing was held on May 13) the amount raised will be over \$14,000. This result has been achieved primarily by his dogged pursuit of corporate sponsors for the event. Lion Larry has also been involved in managing the club's annual picnic and working at the monthly Health Fair the club conducts at the Good Samaritan Center. His involvement in community affairs has continued in Tellico Village. He served on the Board of the New Villagers organization for three years. He has also served the HOA by being the liaison to the County Board and on the Public Works Advisory committee. When not involved in these activities Larry is a member of WATER and works on maintenance of 1 ½ miles of the East Lakeshore Trail. He also does volunteer work at St. Thomas the Apostle church in Lenoir City.

Looking at this list of accomplishments and involvement in communities in which he has lived it is easy to see that he is well-deserving of receiving the honor of the Melvin Jones Fellowship.
