- **Kahite Annex Committee** – While funds were approved in the five year plan for work to be done on the Kahite Annex, a needs-analysis will be conducted to justify the work that will be done in the future. The kickoff meeting will be next week and the committee will have recommendations put together by the end of the year. The current members are comprised of Bruce Johnson, Chair, Joe Marlette, Marianne Covert, John Everson, Ken Ballien, Tony Bridges, Simon Bradbury-Recreation Manager and Jeff Gagley-Director of Public Works.
- **2017 Board Goals** – The Board gave detailed descriptions of the 2017 Board Goals, as well as their subgoals. They also broke down how they have and will continue to accomplish these goals. On June 21st, the Board will vote to make a change in the By-Laws. Recreation Advisory Committee Highlights

This month, the Recreation Committee discussed all of the positive things going on with trails. There was a wonderful front page article in the Knoxville News Sentinel about Tellico Village and its volunteers. Missy Kane visited recently and was interviewed on TVB. She will be coming back to share a hiking program with us in the Fall. We are now offering paddle board classes at Tugaloo Beach Pavilion on Thursdays. Classes have been full for the first two weeks. It's exciting to see our Villagers trying new things.

WELLNESS CENTER POOL UPDATE – From Recreation Director Simon Bradbury

A new company was hired to install heaters and they will be installed tomorrow.

Two heaters were purchased from a local vendor who we have been doing pool chemical and maintenance work with for over 10 years. We ordered the heaters through them because they are very familiar with our pool, pump room, customers and our standards. If we had problems with the heaters, then we have instant recourse face-to-face with the vendor that we have a relationship with vs. ordering out of state. Unfortunately, we had problems with the heaters they sent us.

They are very efficient durable heaters but were not appropriate for our ventilation system. First, we had to order a conversion adapter for our ventilation system and had to wait on it. When it got here, we began work on it and found that we would have to change some things with the ventilation that would not be up to code. It would require a certified boiler inspector to sign off. We brought in two experts for an outside opinion (at no cost). In order to continue with the heater installation, we would have to change out our entire ventilation system, which would be very expensive. The other option was to hire another local vendor to install the same heaters as we had in the past that the ventilation has already been signed off on.

I fired the original vendor and told him to pick up his heaters. He should have known better and been more responsive, especially after putting our members out for so long and I had emphasized the severity of the situation. The bottom line is that it is on me as the Recreation Director to have the job done right with long term goals in mind and not just a quick fix. I own this, Public Works has been extremely helpful throughout, and I apologize for the inconvenience. It is not at all the standard of operation that I am okay with. I feel I have done everything possible to remedy a challenging situation. You have a right to be frustrated with the situation; it has been down too long. Trust me; I am not a happy camper about the whole pool scenario either!

I have confidence that this company knows their stuff, will do a good job, and will have the pool up and running as soon as possible. When it is operational, I am hosting a pool party at the Wellness Center to celebrate with refreshments and cake! Keep an eye out for the date and time of this pool party, it will be announced soon!
