Butterfly Garden and Release at the Wellness Center

The Tellico Village Garden Club wants to bring back the Monarch. Bill Reeves, Chief Biodiversity Officer with the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, gave a presentation to the Garden Club about the plight of the Monarch and the group wanted to take action. After the presentation, the Garden Club joined the “Bring Back the Monarch” campaign and ordered 75 packets of seed. The club wanted to get the community involved so club members distributed the seeds and Chad Johnson, the Horticulturist in the Public Works department, agreed to help create a butterfly garden near the Wellness Center.

In the fall of 2016, several seed packets were planted in a 15x15 foot bed. By late spring, the barren bed came to life with a multitude of butterfly related plants, including milkweed. The Monarch butterfly relies on Milkweed plants for breeding and nutritional purposes. Unfortunately, Monarch butterflies have declined in recent years due to the destruction of their habitats that grow Milkweed, something that is essential to their survival.

With the addition of the Butterfly Garden, the Tellico Village Garden Club hopes that it will serve as a breeding station for butterflies, including Monarchs. The flowers and wildlife at the Butterfly Garden also offers the community another beautiful place to visit within Tellico Village.

On June 29th, approximately 60 people attended the butterfly release and garden opening. The Garden Club released 24 butterflies. Tim Pyles, a property owner, Garden Club member, and Program Chair, was instrumental in making this happen. Pyles was dedicated to tending to the garden from the beginning and sees it to it that the Garden Club has speakers (such as Bill Reeves) at their meetings.

The first Garden Club president, Margaret Muller, was also honored at the event. In April, she turned 96 years old. Current President, Cae Daly, coordinated a small gathering of Garden Club members at her home afterward to celebrate Margaret’s birthday. If you would like to visit the new Butterfly Garden, it is located next to the Wellness Center.

2017 Annual Beautification Golf Tournament Benefitting Golf Course Beautification and a New Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program

This year the annual Beautification Golf Tournament is being held at Toqua on July 22nd. This event is sponsored by the Golf Advisory Committee and the Toqua, Tanasi and Kahite Beautification Committees. Funds raised by this event will be used to enhance the beauty of all three of our golf courses and the areas surrounding each club house. Tournament sign-up sheets are located at the check-in desks at each club house. Entry fee is \$25/person, plus green fees. Players may sign up as a foursome or individually. The format is a Tennessee Scramble and each group must include at least one woman and one man. To raise additional funds, raffle tickets, mulligans, and a Pro's "really long drive" will be sold.

Jim West will, once again, prepare hamburgers (\$6) and hot dogs (\$4) for the players. Also, beer and soft drinks will be available in the Pavilion following play. More information can be found at each club house.

In addition, this year, a portion of the funds raised will support a new project the GAC has undertaken – application to the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program for Golf Courses. Members of the newly formed Audubon Committee have already completed the first 27 pages of a very lengthy and detailed application form. It is expected that this application process could take a couple of years to complete. The committee is being supported by our three golf courses superintendents, the GAC, the Beautification Committees, the Woodworkers Club, Photography Club, Tennessee Bluebird Society and WATeR. Being a Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Golf Course will be quite a plus for our community.

Audubon Certified courses must meet specific criteria in the areas of environmental planning; wildlife and habitat management; outreach and education; chemical use reduction and safety; water conservation; and water quality management. They have taken positive steps to preserve and enhance wildlife habitat while protecting the integrity of their course's land and water resources. Golf courses throughout North and Central America, Europe, Africa, Asia and Australia have achieved certification through this program, but only 825 golf courses worldwide have been designated as *Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuaries*. There are fewer than twenty *Certified Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary* courses in Tennessee.
