PAVEMENT AND PRESERVATION UPDATE

Jeff Gagley, Public Works Director, has announced that a Pavement Preservation Product will be placed on the Kahite and Wellness Center Parking Lots and Dohi Road leading to the Center the week of October 9-14. The product being used is a High Density Mineral Bond known as HA5 and will be applied in two coats.

Over the last nine months, a team consisting of Ken Holland (chair of PSAC) and Charles Queener, both of the Public Services Advisory Committee (PSAC) and Mr. Gagley have been researching and studying various ways and products to extend the life of our roads and lots and also obtaining engineering specifications for the paving of roads and lots when that becomes necessary. During this process, HA5 has become one of the most recommended preservation products which also meets the standard of being on the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) Qualified Product List, and offers a five-year warranty. HA5 was first manufactured in Utah by Holbrook Asphalt Company and has been widely used in the western states for many years effectively combatting asphalt deterioration from intense UV rays as well as some hard winters. The proprietary product is now manufactured in the eastern US by Whitaker Contracting located in Guntersville, Alabama. The Tennessee approved applicator of the product is Jarrett Builders located in Nashville, Tennessee.

During the early months of the road study, Jim Reed from Whitaker Contracting and Benny Shepherd, Vice-President of the Asphalt Division of Jarrett Builders, observed some of our roads and provided additional information about HA5. Mr. Donald Reid drove many of our roads and lots and recommended HA5 to us. Mr. Reid is the Assistant Director of Public Works, Metro Nashville. Mr. Reid also took Holland and Queener to several locations in Nashville where HA5 was installed, one being outside Nissan Stadium. They also were able to observe Jarrett Builders placing HA5 on some streets in Portland, Tennessee. In addition to preservation, it is anticipated that bid requests will be sent out in early 2018, for milling and paving of Sequoyah Road and Chota Road from Highway 444 to the fire station and the Tanasi and Yacht Club Parking Lots. The specifications for this work will be prepared by Foundation System Engineering (FSE) in Knoxville who will provide on-site inspections and then conduct lab verifications through their Construction Material Laboratory (CML). This project was initially planned for 2017, but deferred until early next year so more detailed specifications could be prepared.

Over the past few weeks, the Pavement Preservation Product Reclamite was placed on the roads in Chatuga, Toqua Coves and on Chota Road from the fire station to the northern connection to Highway 444. Reclamite is a rejuvenation product on the TDOT Qualified Product List and has been used for over 40 years. It is designed to re-balance the chemistry of the oxidized pavement, provide the ability to delay the aging process and reverse premature aging.

AMERICAN LEGION INVITES ALL VETERANS

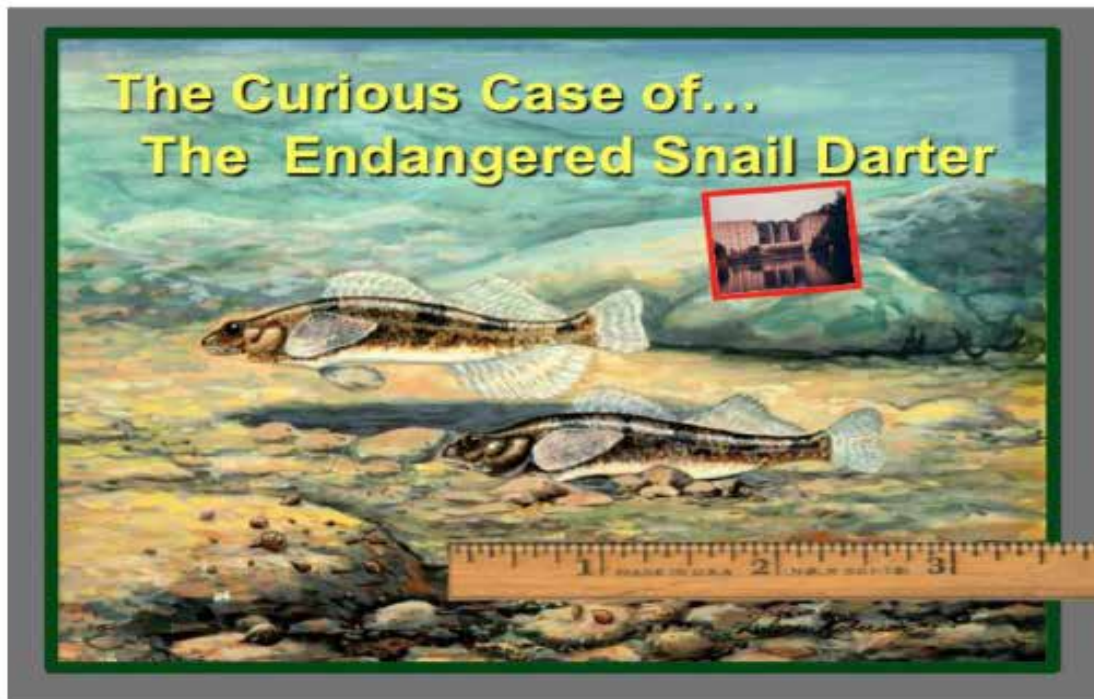

GETTING STARTED WITH A BLUEBIRD TRAIL ON A GOLF COURSE
