STATE RECOGNITION FOR TELLICO VILLAGE RECREATION

The Tennessee Recreation and Parks Association (TRPA) is an organization comprised of roughly 1,400 professional members involved in public and private recreation departments in the state of Tennessee from Johnson City to Memphis. Tellico Village was on the tip of many tongues at this year's Tennessee Recreation and Parks Association Annual Conference. This annual conference is a fantastic opportunity for professionals in the field of Parks and Recreation to enhance their personal abilities through educational opportunities, vendor events and socialization with their peers.

Tellico Village Recreation Director, Simon Bradbury, was in attendance of the state conference, held this year in Franklin, TN. He was nominated and voted in as President Elect for 2018-2019, representing Tellico Village at the state level. His friend and colleague, Lauren Cox from the town of Farragut, was elected as Vice President.

Three other Tellico Village residents, though not in attendance, were also part of the conversation at the October 25th Awards Ceremony. These residents were acknowledged for their fine work and volunteer service during 2017 for their work on trail planning and building.

Marsha Herzog and Dave Noble, members of the Internal Trails Committee, committed their invaluable expertise to the cause through research and planning. This led to some of the newest nature trails here in Tellico Village. Marsha was recognized by Simon during the November Board of Directors meeting and presented with her certificate of achievement. Dave, who was unable to attend, was presented with his volunteer service award prior to the meeting.



The third honoree, Gary Mulliner, gained recognition for donating countless hours of his time and energy into the art of trail building Tellico Village. After building numerous miles of trails, practically on his own in the Kahite neighborhood, Gary started working with Simon in 2017 to bring several miles of nature trails into the main Village. With Gary's help, a regular group of eager and talented trail blazers meet on a weekly basis to continuously improve the walkability of Tellico Village. These trails started in the wooded area behind the Wellness Center and continues to grow weekly with the newest completed section, Charlie's Crossing, linking the Wellness Center area to the Chota Center area via the Tellico Village Baptist Church.



Simon now has a plan for the continued expansion of trails, based on the Greenway Project of 2015, into neighborhoods all throughout the Village. Neighborhood trails can also be assessed individually if there is enough interest generated in a particular area. So get together with your neighbors, come to a consensus, generate a group of volunteers and elect a spokesperson. Simon, with the help of Public Works, will assess the feasibility of a trails based on maps produced in the Greenway Study and might just be digging a trail in a neighborhood near you.

This is an in and out hike to Abrams Falls from the Abrams Creek Ranger Station via the Cooper Road Trail, Little Bottoms Trail and Abrams Falls Trail. The trails consist of up and down terrain with a few steep portions and some rock hopping stream crossings. Most of the trail follows Abrams Creek offering great views of the rushing water and mountain ridges.

MUDDY BOOTS HIKE

Join us on December 11th as we hike the Halls Bend Trail (aka Boy Scout Trail). Meet at Chota Center (across from Marathon gas station & in parking lot of Lakeside Realty) at 8:45 a.m. for a 9 a.m. departure. This trail is only about a mile north of the north entrance to Tellico Village on Route 444. The first section of the hike will be an easy 2 mile hike along the shore of the lake, perfect for persons new to hiking. After the easy section the trail continues with some elevation and views of Tellico Lake, Wind River, and the Smokies. Walking the whole trail the hike will be a moderate loop hike of 5 miles. Also, experienced hikers bring an extra pair of shoes and place their hiking boots, if dirty, in a trash bag to try to keep the driver's car floor clean. A section of the trail we will be hiking can be muddy. In the event of a situation requiring medical intervention during a hike, we suggest that each participant wear their Name Tag and bring a Photo ID (generally driver's license) and Medical Information cards (Health Insurance Card or Medicare + supplemental Health Insurance Cards)

SANTA CLAUS OPEN





PETS OF THE WEEK: MEET MAYBETH, MAYA, AND KARA!

Maybeth and Maya arrived at the shelter together when their owner fell on hard times. Maybeth and Maya are both 2 year old grey and white females with golden eyes. Maybeth and Maya are a domestic shorthair mix and are such fantastic cats. Maybeth is very friendly and has a sweet and somewhat silly personality. Maya is super friendly and quite spunky.

Kara is a grey and black 1 year old domestic shorthair mix with green eyes. This sweet girl has been waiting patiently for a loving home. Kara is very outgoing and likes to be held. Will you be the one to help her spend this holiday season in her new home?

Please remember their personality may not show through immediately in the shelter environment. Their condo is now their "safe place" and some struggle a bit when meeting new people in this environment. Take the time to meet each cat. Pet the cats while they are still in their condo and let them get used to you for a few moments before you pick him/her up. Once you get them home and give them time to acclimate to the new environment, they will feel secure and all will be well.

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped (with registration). Cats are litter box trained. \$40 adoption fee.

Shelter Needs: Lots of scoopable/clumping cat litter (Tidy Cat), Paper Towels, Laundry detergent, copy paper, bleach, Q-tips, cotton balls, and Original blue Dawn-all cleaning & office supplies are always needed. Volunteers are always welcome.

The Monroe County Animal Shelter is located at 170 Kefauver Lane in Madisonville (behind Wal-Mart). Please note new hours: Tuesday-Friday from 11-4:30 and Saturdays from 11-2. The shelter is closed to the public on Sunday and Monday.
