Board Election on the Horizon

Election season for the POA Board positions begins in earnest this month. The deadline for candidates to declare for the 2012 Tellico Village Property Owners Association Board of Directors election is 3 p.m., Friday, Sept. 14. That is the date candidates must turn in their application to the POA at the Administrative building. Application packages may be picked up from the front desk at the Administrative building. There are two seats up for election this year. Oct. 1 is the deadline for Villagers to volunteer to serve on any of the advisory committees. Serving on a committee is a great way to be involved in the current and future direction of Tellico Village. Packets to apply for committee seats are also available at the Administrative building front desk.

Board election details

2012 marks the fifth year for electronic voting by Tellico Village property owners to select the candidates to fill the available Board seats. In 2011, nearly 2,000 Villagers cast their ballot for the candidates of their choice via the Internet.

Just as it was last year, the process will be straightforward and offer multiple options for Tellico Village property owners to participate and cast a ballot.

Election packets will arrive at property owner mailboxes on or about Nov. 1 as in years past. And, as in years past, the letter will list the candidates running for the two open seats on the Board and describe the procedures for electronic voting. More importantly, the letter will contain a specific, secure username and password for each property owner vote.

By following the instructions in the letter, a property owner will use their specific username and password and log onto the website (listed on the letter) to vote for the candidates of their choice. The polls will be open from Nov. 1 until noon on Dec. 6. The results of the election will be announced at a scheduled meeting Dec. 7.

“What if I prefer to vote via paper ballot?”

Some property owners prefer to vote using a paper ballot to cast their vote for the Board candidates. If that is the case, the election information letter also contains instructions on how to request a paper ballot.

Beginning Nov. 1, any property owner needing a paper ballot will call 1-866-799-1799 and leave a voice message with the information needed to request a paper ballot. Each day, a POA staff member will retrieve the information from the voicemail box and place a paper ballot packet in the mail.

When receiving the requested paper ballot, the property owner will complete the ballot in accordance with the enclosed instructions. They will then place the ballot in the enclosed self-addressed stamped envelope and place it in the mail.

That envelope will go to Votenet. Votenet is the contractor conducting this year’s election for the POA. Votenet staff members will enter the votes from valid paper ballots received. All of those votes will be counted with the electronic votes cast by other property owners via the Internet.

“What happens at the end of the voting period?”

On Dec. 7, the POA Board of Directors Election Committee will direct a POA staff member to log onto the administrative portion of the Votenet website to access the results of the 2012 Tellico Village POA Board election. Everyone in attendance at that meeting will

simultaneously see the results of the election.

“Where can I vote?”

Villagers are welcome to bring their letter with their username and password to any of several locations in order to vote electronically. The POA offices are open for voting Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Tellico Village Public Library has computers with Internet access and they are open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9 a.m. to noon Saturday.
