Board election nears

Three Tellico Village residents have declared their intention to run for the two available seats in this year's Board of Directors election. The two seats available are currently held by Chris Garner and Ginny Ranck.

Declaring their candidacy and submitting their application packet are: Rick Blough, Tom Lee and Ginny Ranck. The Village's Voting page is available on the website in the member area as its own page. I encourage all property owners to become familiar with the candidates and cast your vote in this year's election. The voting period opens Nov. 1, and the results will be announced Dec. 7. Committee seats need volunteers

The POA is still accepting applications for volunteers to fill seats on several of the advisory committees. If you are interested in serving the community by sitting on one of the committees, application packets are available at the POA administrative building.

Applications will be accepted until Oct. 1. After that date, managers will schedule meetings with applicants to put the best folks on the committee that matches their expertise and fills a need for the POA. The Board of Directors will approve and install new committee members at the December Board meeting.

Budget meetings

The POA budget process gets rolling over the next few weeks. Parker Owen, Finance Director, has set up a schedule of meetings to help get us to the finish line and approve a budget at our November Board meeting. Throughout the process, the departments will review their budgets with the Finance Advisory Committee and Board Members.

Some progress has already happened as the department managers have received budget guidelines and Capital/Reserves templates from the Finance Director. Managers submitted responses and met with the Finance Director in August. Earlier in September, the Finance Director submitted an initial

Library Gets New Name

The soon-to-be-completed building that will house the Tellico Village Library will be up and running in October 2012. Along with the new space, the new furniture and the new shelving, the library will be sporting a new name: The Public Library at Tellico Village.

To emphasize that the facility is part of the five-library Loudon County system, the Board of Directors voted on the name change in August. The other Loudon County libraries are: the Lenoir City Public Library, the Loudon Public Library, the Greenback Public Library and the Philadelphia Public Library.

The move from the current storefront location at 304 Lakeside Plaza will expand the new library's space from 2,000 square feet to 6,250 useable square feet. Besides housing the growing collection of books, DVD's, periodicals, newspapers and the usual items you would expect to find in a library, there will be 15 computer terminals available and comfortable reading spaces to relax and peruse your reading materials of choice. A meeting room large enough to accommodate 35-40 people auditorium style and an outdoor courtyard meeting space will be available to groups for rental on a reservation basis.

The new building is located at 300 Irene Road, next to Tellico Village but not actually "in" Tellico Village. Residents of Loudon County are encouraged to utilize the new facilities of the Public Library at Tellico Village. Check us out at <http://www.tvlibrary.org/>
