Winter Directory Available for Review

United Way Campaign in Full Swing

As of Sunday, Oct. 14, 430 contributions had been received in the fall Tellico Village United Way campaign, totaling \$56,207.76. This amount is 66.9% of the \$85,000 goal. Tip contributions from Gas Day at the Village Marathon gas station were \$1375.76, which is a new record. This was enhanced by a significant contribution from MG Markets, operator of the Village station, which contributes 5 cents per gallon pumped on Gas Day from all their stations, not just the Village station.

Although the contribution amounts are a little ahead of last year, we continue to be concerned with low participation rates which have dropped in recent years to a little more than 20 percent. Last year, we revitalized a participation percentage competition among Village neighborhoods in honor of our campaign founder, Art Spurrier.

Results so far this year are: Chatuga 14.4%, Chota 11.2%, Coyatee 11.3%, Mialaquo 15.9%, Tanasi 13.7%, Tommotley 10.8%, and Toqua 15.6%. I expect to receive data from Kahite, last

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year's winner, at the end of their campaign.

If you have not yet done so, please review the UW materials you received in the mail or in your paper box, and contribute to this important campaign, as more than 30 important local agencies are included, including our Tellico Village Volunteer Fire Department and the Computer Users Club's TAP computer recycling program.
