Board working on By-Law changes

The POA Board has been hard at work over the past couple of months reviewing the current By-Laws and considering potential revisions to improve the document. The By-Laws were originally drafted by the developer and from a developer's perspective. Some of the existing language in the By-Laws is no longer fully compatible with the manner in which the POA now operates. The Board's proposed revisions are aimed at improving the By-Laws so they better serve the needs of the POA for the future.

The Board has placed the proposed revisions on the POA website on the Board of Directors page. There is an email address to send suggestions to the POA and Board on these proposed revisions. Any suggestions on these proposed revisions may be sent to boardconsideration@tvpoa.org.

The Board will review any suggested revisions and take them into consideration as they further refine the proposed revisions to the By-Laws. A letter will be sent to all property owners advising them of the proposed revisions and the date, time and place of the meeting where the Board will vote on the proposed revisions.
