Tips for Using Your Tellico Village Winter Directory

The Winter Directory is here! If you wish to purchase an extra or two, we have them in the POA Administrative Office for \$3.30 (\$3 plus tax) (remember, they are published by Loudon County Publishers and no assessment dollars go to its production nor distribution—it is a courtesy).

First, put a tab or paperclip on page 11—it is the Table of Contents and Frequently Called Numbers.

Second, put a tab or paperclip on page 15—it is the Activities Directory. Highlight or underline EQUIPMENT—CHILD and EQUIPMENT-MEDICAL. These are the two most frequent inquiries to come into the POA Office.

Third, put a tab or paperclip on page 20—Village Businesses. This handy page lists the businesses throughout the Village (including Food Lion) and their location.

Fourth, highlight or underline any phone number you look up. Chances are you will call it again someday, and marking it will make it easier to find in the future.

Fifth, take your old Summer Directory and put it in your car. You never know when you will need the map or a phone number.

These few simple steps will streamline finding the information you want without making multiple phone calls to be directed to those pages, thus allowing POA staff to stay on task.

TDEC Issues Drinking Water Report

Tellico Village recently received notice from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation stating:

"Pursuant to the Tennessee Safe Drinking Water Act a sanitary survey of the waterworks system was initiated on September 21, 2012, and concluded with a second site visit on September 26, 2012. Director of Water Resources personnel, Beth Walker and Richard Lambert, appreciated meeting with the Public Works Department Manager, Glen Quillen, and Doug Brown.

"In accordance with the 'Sanitary Survey Manual for Community and Non-Community Public Water Supplies,' the facility received a numerical rating of **98**, placing it among the State's **Approved** water systems."
