

## UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN OFF AND RUNNING

Thanks to great weather and a sizeable crowd, the 4th annual Street/Business Fair launched the 2018 UW Campaign in the village to a great start. Village Square in and around the Welcome Center was populated with tents, tables, and chairs. A large grill populated by village businesses, partner agencies, and volunteers prepared and served the hot dogs, cookies, chips and water. And of course, most importantly, the area immediately around the Center itself was populated by 43 vehicles from the Village Corvette, Vintage/Classic Car, and Motorcycle Clubs, all on display for viewing by visitors and competing for most popular vehicle in each class.

After tallying the donations collected for United Way at the rate of \$1/vote the following vehicles were judged most popular in each class:

- Corvette a 2008 Corvette owned by Hobie Horchler;
- Classic/Vintage a 1957 Ford Thunderbird owned by Ted Newton;
- Motorcycle a Yamaha X5650 owned by Roy Moore.

Each winner received a \$25 gift certificate at a local restaurant. The total amount raised through votes was \$240. Thanks to all the vehicle owners and voters who participated.

Another feature of the Fair was an opportunity for residents to learn more about the partner agencies of United Way; these are the agencies who, after a vigorous vetting process, receive funds from UW. The following partners participated and had information tables for residents to visit:

Each household will receive one which contains detailed information on the 32 partner agencies as well as the necessary forms to complete and mail along with their donation made out to United Way Loudon County. ## TV LIONS INSTALL A NEW COLLECTION

In order to facilitate the process of collecting used eyeglasses, pill containers and used hearing aids and make it more convenient for donors, the TV Lions have purchased and installed a new collection facility for these items. The new collection station (pictured below) is located at the rear of the Welcome Center in what was formerly the drive thru lanes for the bank. The station can be accessed by going around the right side of the center (as you face it; the second photo shows the lane of entry); you then simply pull up to the station and drop your items into the large post-office style box.

The items can be dropped into the container without leaving your vehicle. As indicated above, three items can be placed in the container. They are used eyeglasses which are collected and sent to a Lions Recycling Center in Roanoke, VA, where they are refurbished, as necessary, classified as to prescription and then sent overseas, primarily to third world countries where they are given to those needing them, free of charge.

Pill containers can also be placed in the box. The acceptable type container is as pictured below. It is critical that the labels be removed from them. This can best be done by soaking the container in water for a couple of hours; the labels come off quite easily after the soaking. An alternative is to purchase Goo-Gone, which is designed specifically for removing labels and the residual glue on items such as these containers. The collected containers are taken by the Lions to an NGO located in Columbus, OH, from where they are shipped, again, to primarily third world countries. They are used by physicians and drug dispensers in these countries to eliminate loss and damage to pills that occurs when the patients simply carry their medications in their hands or pockets.

The third item that can be placed in the container are used hearing aids. They are sent to the Hearing and Speech Foundation in Maryville, TN, where they are

refurbished and given to indigent residents of Loudon County.

How successful has the collection effort been in the past? In the last Lions business year, 1598 pairs of used eyeglasses were sent to Roanoke; 5640 pill containers to Columbus and about 40 pairs of used hearing aids to Maryville. Hopefully, with the convenience of the new collection station these figures will increase during the current business year.

The success of this program as with all other TV Lions service efforts are only possible with the support of TV residents. An example of this support is the recently completed Oktoberfest. Over 600 residents attended making this both a social as well as financial success.

Why is something like this important? The profits from this event, estimated at about \$4,000, enable financial support to a number of service efforts. For example, in a recent month, the Lions Health Fair vision tested 32 individuals at the Good Samaritan Center in Lenoir City. Of those, 25 needed glasses; all 25 were eligible for free glasses which were provided to them. The cost to the Lions club in that one month alone was \$3,200. If another recent donation, \$2,000 to the TV Library is added, more than the entire profit from the Oktoberfest was used in just one month. It is for reasons such as this that community support to Lions fund-raisers is so critical. Again, the Lions thank you for your support and hope it continues well into the future.



## LONG RANGE STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

Over 40% of Tellico Village property owners completed the Long-Range Strategic Plan (LRSP) Questionnaire. This level of participation is unprecedented and the Long-Range Planning Advisory Committee (LRPAC) wants to thank all you who took the time to help "Shape Our Future". This input will be an important element in the committee's final recommendations to the POA. The final LRSP will include other sources of information including data analysis and forecasting, benchmarking other active adult communities, focus groups, and much more. We are still analyzing the results which include reviewing over 1,900 comments. As promised, one of the basic tenets of the LRPAC is communication and transparency. Therefore, the LRPAC will now share some partial and preliminary results.

#### **Vision**

- •61% of respondents chose the following vision statement: Maintain what we have, adding amenities only when needed and justified. Assessments and fees will be raised only enough to pay for infrastructure maintenance and justified amenities.
- •33% of respondents chose the following vision statement: Tellico Village will set the standard for active adult communities by continuously improving our community and by adapting to our property owners' changing needs. Assessments and fees will be increased to achieve a best in class community with a high-quality lifestyle but remain competitive and fiscally stable.
- •5% of respondents chose the following vision statement: Maintain the Village as it is without adding additional amenities or expanding existing facilities. Assessments and fees will only be increased for existing infrastructure maintenance and inflation.
- •The "Vision" results were similar across age and residency bands.
- •51% of respondents want to keep TV primarily as a retirement community and 38% supported encouraging working adults and families to move into TV.

Demographics

- •85% of respondents were 60-79 years of age; 9% were younger than 59; 6% were older than 80.
- •38% of households had lived in the Village less than 5 years; 21% 5-10; 33% 11-20; 9% 20+ years.

#### **Top Priorities**

- •Village finances, aesthetics and environment, growth, recreational amenities, and property owners' vision for the future of the Village were chosen as the 5 top priorities.
- •Finance was the number 1 priority issue.
- •84% of respondents are satisfied with TV's aesthetics but many comments suggested concern for the future. Concerns included maintaining our natural environment and enforcement of Village rules.
- •Our restaurants, recreational facilities, waterfront, and golf were all chosen as enhancing the value of TV. Commercial businesses had the lowest percentage of responses to this question.
- •Overwhelmingly, our recreational facilities (golf, wellness center, etc.) met or exceeded expectations.

#### Growth

- •67% of respondents were very satisfied or satisfied with our current and projected growth, 13% were very dissatisfied or dissatisfied.
- •When asked how the POA should approach growth 53% of respondents chose "encourage growth and plan for it" while 38% chose "allow growth to occur passively"

The next step in the development of the Long-Range Strategic Plan will be conducting focus groups. Over 600 Villagers volunteered to participate in the focus groups. #### LENOIR CITY FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER GETS LATEST TCF GRANT

Susan Fox was pleased when she got the call from the Tellico Community Foundation informing her that the Lenoir City School System was the latest recipient of a grant from the TCF for the "Let's TALK" early childhood literacy project. Fox is the Director of the Lenoir City Family Resource Center (LCFRC). "This grant will be a tremendous help to us and we are so pleased to be selected," Fox said.

LCFRC is the school district's link between the home, school, agencies, and community. Fox leads the core team behind the "Let's TALK" project that also includes Lenoir City Elementary Principal Don Maloney, preschool lead teacher Melody Hobbs, parent educator Linda Tillery interpreter/translator Mary Gonzalez, and LCFRC Assistant

Wendy Stooksbury.

Early Childhood Literacy is one of the recently announced focus areas for the TCF. The Foundation will concentrate its grantmaking on the literacy needs of Loudon and Monroe County communities, including both English and Spanish-speaking populations.

According to Fox, learning begins at birth and the brain develops more in the first five years than at any other time during a person's life. Deficits in early literacy and math begin well before kindergarten with skill gaps widening along family income lines from as early as 9 months of age and growing exponentially by 24 months.



Principal Maloney further commented, "Research has demonstrated that early literacy and math skills at kindergarten entry predict future academic success. That's why we are excited about the TCF grant. It will help in a critical area." TCF's initial grant will provide \$500 for the purchase of bilingual books for children in the 0-4 age

The 8.1-mile ascent will start on the Appalachian Trail from Newfound Gap. The starting elevation is 5000 feet and we will ascend about 1200 feet in the 2.7 miles to the junction with the Boulevard Trail at Mt. Ambler. Leaving the AT for the Boulevard Trail we will descend about 500 feet in the first mile. In the next 3 miles we will gradually climb back 300 feet to an elevation of 6000 feet. The last 1.3 miles will have us climbing about 700 feet to the Lodge at Mt. LeConte. There will be very nice vistas to see during the hike on the A.T. and Boulevard.

On the 5.0-mile hike down the Alum Cave trail, we will see some of the most spectacular scenery in the park. This trail is steep and there are numerous places where the park has installed cabling to hold onto for safety purposes. The views are wonderful!! There are two major distinguishing features on this trail. The first that we will come to is Alum Cave Bluffs, which is a little more than half way to the bottom. Leaving the cave, we will come to Inspiration Point where we will have wonderful views of the valley on our way to Arch Rock, the other major feature on the trail.

Hiking boots and hiking sticks are recommended.

Driving directions will be provided the morning of the hike.

Bring water and a trail lunch.

Carpooling is recommended, passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas, etc.
