BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS 10/24/18

Minutes- The minutes for the October board workshop were approved by the Board 7-0

HOA- Ellen Fox presented the HOA update. She updated everyone again on the coming update to the HOA membership model. The changes include the revamp of the Neighborhood Watch program. As well as a membership due increase by \$5 from the current price of \$10 to the new price of \$15. However, if dues are payed via credit card the cost will only be \$10. But if they are payed with check or cash they will cost the new set price of \$15. She also updated the board and those in attendance on the HOA joining the Lenoir City committee of 100, and of the recent establishment of the HOA East Tennessee Bridge Project Ad Hoc Committee. The next HOA social will be on Nov. 13 and the general meeting is scheduled for Nov. 29th.

Finance Report- Parker Owen presented the update. Revenue to date is \$218,000 above budget; however, maintenance is positioned to bring this variance closer to the projected amount. To date 118 tanks have been completed, there was a budgeted amount of 96. No doubt we will overrun the revenues on tank installations. Property transfers are \$30,000 above budget. Growth is exceeding budgeted numbers and therefore creating a favorable variance in the budget. The HA5 treatment work cost is coming in at \$20,000 below budget and will hit on the

October budget. However, \$55,000 of spending for this is going to the 2019 budget due to postponing a portion of the projects. The first Board review of the budget and five-year plan is scheduled for Tuesday October 30, 2018 from 10 a.m.- noon in the POA conference room. The bids held for the Toqua and Kahite Activity Center will be evaluated, and the recommended bid will be reflected in the five-year budget for 2019.

AWE QBR- Andy Fox presented his companies update. Events attendance for the restaurants remains robust. Kahite Clubhouse is doing good and is up \$32,115. Toqua Clubhouse revenue as compared to last year has increased by 1.1%. The Yacht Club has increased 15% in total sales from this time last year.

Marketing Report- Beth Kuberka reported on her department. Database leads for this year to date is 5,159 which is up 15% and was originally projected to be down 7%. Digital leads are up 33%, Trade show leads are up 77%, and Welcome Center leads are up 36%. Program sales are currently totaling 169 sales which is up 12% vs. 2017 and up 8% vs. the objective. MLS sales are 303 which is up 3% from this time last year. Lot sales are up 43% and residential sales are down 9%. The cost per lead is \$56.89 v. \$43.91 a year ago, but the YTD conversion rate rose to 2.24% from 1.85% a year ago. The total revenue for the Marketing department so far is \$88,000 and the total expenses is \$275,000. Cost of marketing is \$81,095 or about \$14 per lot. There is an unprecedented need to inform and clarify misunderstanding and misinterpretation about the marketing program. Current projects in the works are; updating the marketing website, launch of a new social program, as well as google mobile prioritization. The marketing division is currently managing a working marketing database of over 27,500 qualified leads.

Timeless Tellico Foundation- Simon Bradbury introduced the idea of the foundation and brought industry foundation experts to share insight as well speak about their experience in the field. The Timeless Tellico Foundation would focus raising money to better the amenities and infrastructure of Tellico Village through donations. Simon also spoke about a possible partnership with the Legacy Parks Foundation. Joe Beal talked about the Tellico Community Foundation and how he feels we do not need two foundations servicing the village. The Board will continue to look into both options.

Wellness Center Master Plan- Simon Bradbury and members of the RAC reviewed their strategic plan as well as what they had accomplished in 2018 thus far. The plan will evaluate the recreation department organization, member and user fees, existing and future programs/amenities, existing and future facilities, ongoing maintenance cost of programs and facilities, marketing strategies to improve revenue and cost recovery, and future trends in recreation to meet the current and next generation's needs. The board ask them to answer some questions they had and paused this discussion until a later date.

Revised Purchasing Policy- Kevin Stevens reviewed and spoke on the revisions of the purchasing policy and the consistency with governing Tennessee laws. The revisions were an attempt to eliminate references to Tennessee law that does not apply to Tellico Village. These revisions were approved 7-0.

Drink Prices Increase- Mike Colacone presented this section. The board intends to raise the drink price in the Village for the first time in 10 years. He overviewed the options that were before the Board, and the choice of raising all alcoholic beverages by \$.50 starting January 1 that they board agreed to. This was approved 7-0.

The Board will not exercise it's right to vote the poallots in this years board election.

UNITED WAY DONATION FORMS-COMING SOON

Within the next several days you will be receiving your 2018 United Way Campaign donation forms in your mailbox. The mailing will contain an information brochure about the 28 UW partner agencies – those service organizations that receive funds from United Way, general information about UW and the campaign, a donor pledge form to fill out to accompany your donation and a pre-addressed envelope to mail your donation. The form provides options for the method of giving. The simplest is to enclose your check made out to UWLC (United Way Loudon County); you also have the option of deferring your full amount into payments over a period of time. There is also an option where you can designate a specific charity or charities to receive your donation.

Some questions have arisen relative to the impact the 2017 tax law has on charitable donation deductibility. Under the provisions of the new law there is no change in the deductibility of donations made to qualified charitable organization. United Way and its partner agencies meet that qualification. There are two changes however that may affect your giving. The first is the deductibility threshold. Previously it was 50% of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI); that has been raised to 60%.

The other change is in the standard deduction that all taxpayers are entitled to. It has almost doubled – from \$6,350 to \$12,000 for a single taxpayer and from \$12,700 to \$24,000 for a married joint return. The primary impact of this change is that the tax impact of charitable donations is reduced. What that means is that if you were motivated to donate to charities by the tax implications that motivation is reduced because you receive a much larger standard deduction that may offset the benefit of your charitable donation deductions. Hopefully, this will not be a factor since you donate to help those less fortunate and not just to get a tax break.

One thing that has not changed in the law is the use of the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for an IRA. A donation made in that manner is tax free, so this may be a way to save some tax dollars and not neutralize, to some degree, the impact of the higher standard deduction. If you choose this route consult with your financial advisor on how best to accomplish this method of giving.

Whatever you do, please choose one of these methods and donate to United Way. You will be helping your neighbors, those both here in the village and the county at large, to solve some overbearing problems and lead to a better life.

DOCK CAPTAINS

Attention Village Boating Enthusiasts.

Thinking of getting a watercraft (boat / jet-ski / kayak) in the next year or two? Or presently keeping your boat somewhere locally but would rather have a Tellico Village community dock?

As many of you know, the Village community docks are currently at capacity. In the original 1996 plan for our marinas the TVA permitted additional docks only in the Tanasi basin. If additional facilities are to be built in time for the boating season of 2019, how many extra slips will be needed?

Members of the Board of Directors of the POA have asked the Dock Captains committee to poll the Village to develop an estimate of how many additional slips might be needed for 2019. If there is enough interest, a project may be initiated.

So, if you think that 2019 might be the year for you to get into boating, or that you want to relocate your existing watercraft, and that you would want a Tellico Village community uncovered slip, please let us know. What kind of craft will it be? A kayak, a boat or a jet ski - perhaps all three! If it's a boat, does it exceed 24 feet?

Tellico Village Advisory Committees

Architectural Control

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) advises and makes recommendations to the TVPOA Board of Directors and ACC administrators. The Committee Communicates with property owners, contractors and concerned parties regarding Tellico Village construction and shoreline strip status. The ACC reviews applications, issues permits and enforces the Declaration and Protective Covenants of Tellico Village and the committee's rules, regulations and standards as provided in Article XI of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions. The committee is available to property owners and contractors to listen to their questions and concerns and to help resolve them. The ACC meets at 9 a.m. on the first and third Thursday of each month at the TVPOA Office.

Communications

The Communications Advisory Committee (CAC) advises the Director of Communications on communications with property owners, non-residents, outside organizations and governmental bodies. CAC oversees the TVPOA website, Tell-E-Gram, Tell-Events and a community service television channel called Tellico Village Broadcasting (TVB). The committee meets at 9:00 a.m. on the first Friday of each month at the TVPOA office.

Marketing

The Maketing Advisory Committee (MAC) advises the Director of Communications with developing and implementing Strategic and Marketing Plans directed at influencing potential property owners to move to Tellico Village, thus stimulating MLS home and Lot sales, increasing property values, supporting POA lot sales and new building permits and attracting families to our community.

Public Services

The focus of the Public Services Advisory Committee (PSAC) is to advise the Director of Public Works and to make recommendations to the TVPOA Board on matters pertaining to construction, maintenance, repairs and improvements of the common property and facilities in Tellico Village. The wide scope of PSAC's responsibility covers such areas as roads, buildings, water, sewer, brush and leaf removal, RV/boat storage, and docks to name a few. The group meets at 9 a.m. on the first Wednesday of each month at the TVPOA office.

Golf

The Golf Advisory Committee (GAC) advises the Director of Golf regarding all aspects of golf. This would encompass such areas as aesthetics, development and modifications, maintenance, and operations of the courses, pro shops and other golf facilities. GAC meets at 3:00 p.m. on the Tuesday before the Board meeting each month in the TVPOA offices.

Long Range Planning

The Long Range Planning Advisory Committee (LRPAC) advises the Tellico Village Board of Directors on long-range issues facing the Village and proceeds to update the Long Range Strategic Vision (LRSV) for Tellico Village. The LRSV serves as a guide for development in Tellico Village that extends beyond the Five Year Plan and is intended to assist in the orderly development of proposals that will guide the village to meet the expectations of property owners as we continue to grow. This will include the use of economically sound monetary policies and effective utilization of our resources on a continuing basis. The LRPAC meets at 9:30 a.m. on the fourth Thursday of each month in the TVPOA

Recreation

The Recreation Advisory Committee (RAC) advises the Recreation Director and communicates with TVPOA members on recreation programs, including the operations of the recreation facilities, lake activities and related programs, health, fitness, clubs, social activities for TVPOA members and their guest, including concers of TVPOA members.. RAC meets at 9:00 a.m. on the second Thursday of each month at the Wellness Center.

Finance

The Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) advises and makes recommendations to the Chief Financial Officer on the financial affairs of the TVPOA. It provides the primary forum for presentation and review of detailed budget proposals by department heads and for obtaining input and comments on budget proposals from property owners. It serves as a sounding board for property owners on financial matters, and, with the concurrence of the CFO. A background in accounting or finance is valued, but not necessary. The group meets at 9:00 a.m. on the Friday immediately preceding the monthly Tellico Village Board of Directors meeting in the TVPOA offices.



Mews is a big friendly 1½ year old white and grey female tabby who is so sweet and calm. She's an indoor cat and should be the only cat in the house. She has not been tested with dogs but would make a great lap cat for a 1-pet household and she would love to have a cat tree in front of a window. She would earn her keep as a "Watch-Cat" and advise you via body language and chattering of anything important outside, like a squirrel or a moving leaf.

Chloe is an indoor only, sweet tabby girl about 3 years old. She has been a doll while with us. Very affectionate and likes to be held and cuddled. A really nice cat but may not tolerate small children. Older, more respectful children will be a better fit.

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped (with registration). Cats are litter box trained. \$40 adoption fee (over 2 years old) \$50 (under 2 years old).

Shelter Statistics for last week: We took in 45 animals, had 12 adoptions, transferred 54 dogs/cats to our rescue partners, and 4 dogs were returned to their owners.

The Monroe County Friends of Animals (MCFA) operates a monthly food pantry to help pet families in Monroe County. Our supplies are low and we are reaching out to the community to help. Any donations of canned or dry puppy and dog and kitten and cat food are needed and will be appreciated. Donations can be dropped off at the Shelter, during shelter hours. AND Food City in Vonore has a donation barrel by the customer service desk if you want to buy some food and just leave it right in the store. We thank you for your kindness and support.

The Monroe County Animal Shelter is located at 170 Kefauver Lane in Madisonville (behind Wal-Mart) and is open Tuesday-Friday from 11-4:30 and Saturdays from 11-2.
