



VOLUNTEERING

Tellico Village Advisory Committees

Architectural Control

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) advises and makes recommendations to the TVPOA Board of Directors and ACC administrators. The Committee Communicates with property owners, contractors and concerned parties regarding Tellico Village construction and shoreline strip status. The ACC reviews applications, issues permits and enforces the Declaration and Protective Covenants of Tellico Village and the committee's rules, regulations and standards as provided in Article XI of the Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions. The committee is available to property owners and contractors to listen to their questions and concerns and to help resolve them. The ACC meets at 9 a.m. on the first and third Thursday of each month at the TVPOA Office.

Communications

The Communications Advisory Committee (CAC) advises the Director of Communications on communications with property owners, non-residents, outside organizations and governmental bodies. CAC oversees the TVPOA website, Tell-E-Gram, Tell-Events and a community service television channel called Tellico Village Broadcasting (TVB). The committee meets at 9:00 a.m. on the first Friday of each month at the TVPOA office.

Public Services

The focus of the Public Services Advisory Committee (PSAC) is to advise the Director of Public Works and to make recommendations to the TVPOA Board on matters pertaining to construction, maintenance, repairs and improvements of the common property and facilities in Tellico Village. The wide scope of PSAC's responsibility covers such areas as roads, buildings, water, sewer, brush and leaf removal, RV/boat storage, and docks to name a few. The group meets at 9 a.m. on the first Wednesday of each month at the TVPOA office.

Golf

The Golf Advisory Committee (GAC) advises the Director of Golf regarding all aspects of golf. This would encompass such areas as aesthetics, development and modifications, maintenance, and operations of the courses, pro shops and other golf facilities. GAC meets at 3:00 p.m. on the Tuesday before the Board meeting each month in the TVPOA offices.

Recreation

The Recreation Advisory Committee (RAC) advises the Recreation Director and communicates with TVPOA members on recreation programs, including the operations of the recreation facilities, lake activities and related programs, health, fitness, clubs, social activities for TVPOA members and their guest, including concers of TVPOA members. RAC meets at 9:00 a.m. on the second Thursday of each month at the Wellness Center.

Long Range Planning

The Long Range Planning Advisory Committee (LRPAC) advises the Tellico Village Board of Directors on long-range issues facing the Village and proceeds to update the Long Range Strategic Vision (LRSV) for Tellico Village. The LRSV serves as a guide for development in Tellico Village that extends beyond the Five Year Plan and is intended to assist in the orderly development of proposals that will guide the village to meet the expectations of property owners as we continue to grow. This will include the use of economically sound monetary policies and effective utilization of our resources on a continuing basis. The LRPAC meets at 9:30 a.m. on the fourth Thursday of each month in the TVPOA Office.

Finance

The Finance Advisory Committee (FAC) advises and makes recommendations to the Chief Financial Officer on the financial affairs of the TVPOA. It provides the primary forum for presentation and review of detailed budget proposals by department heads and for obtaining input and comments on budget proposals from property owners. It serves as a sounding board for property owners on financial matters, and, with the concurrence of the CFO. A background in accounting or finance is valued, but not necessary. The group meets at 9:00 a.m. on the Friday immediately preceding the monthly Tellico Village Board of Directors meeting in the TVPOA offices.

HIKE TURTLETOWN FALLS CREEK

NO NEED TO SIGN UP TO COME ON THE HIKE, JUST SHOW UP!

Date: Monday, November 12, 2018

Destination: Turtletown Falls Creek Trail

Distance: 4-mile loop Elevation Change: 500 feet

Rating: Moderate Time: 8:00 AM

Location: Car-pooling from Chota Center parking lot across from the Village gas station.

Drive Time/Distance: Approximately 90 minutes, 60 miles

Hike Description:

Join us for an enjoyable 4-mile loop hike in the Cherokee National Forest. This trail follows the river with a beautiful water cascade at the end of the trail. There are some short up and down segments under mostly shaded forest canopy. There is one segment of moderate steepness along the first half of the trail and when returning from the falls.

Driving directions:

Leave parking lot & turn right at light onto Hwy 444/Tellico Parkway. Turn left off Hwy 444 onto Hwy 72 South. In 6 miles, turn right onto Hwy 411. Stay on Hwy 411 for about 7.5 miles until you see the exit for Hwy 68 South (Tellico Plains/Sweetwater). Take the Hwy 68 South exit toward Tellico Plains. Make a left onto Hwy 68 South toward Tellico Plains. Continue on 68 South. Plan on a restroom break at the Hardees or Shell Gas Station in Tellico Plains. After break, continue on Hwy 68 South for about 20 miles to Dugan Rd. Turn right onto Dugan Rd. In 0.4 miles, stay to the right to Duggan Rd. In 0.2 miles, make a right onto Farner (Old Farner) Rd. Go 0.5 mile and turn right about 75 yards after you see a brown Turtletown Creek Falls sign. It will be a gravel road & opposite the gravel road is a light blue siding house. This gravel road, FS1166, is easily missed. If you come across a cemetery on the right, you have gone too far. Go 1.5 miles on Forest Service1166 to the trailhead.

NOTE: Near the trailhead is a grated culvert that will probably have 6-8 inches of flowing water. Most cars should cross easily (SUVs & vehicles with good ground clearance).

Bring water & a trail lunch. We will eat at the trail. Hiking boots & poles are recommended. We will be crossing a few small streams. Bug spray is also recommended. There are no restrooms near the trailhead. Restrooms are available at Hardees or Shell Gas Station in Tellico Plains.

In the event of a situation requiring medical intervention during a hike, we suggest that each participant wear their Name Tag & bring a Photo ID (generally driver's license) & Medical Information cards (Health Insurance Card or Medicare + supplemental Health Insurance (cards)

Cost: Passengers are asked to contribute \$6 to the driver to help cover gas







Their kennel is now their "safe place" and some struggle a bit when removed from it. That, by no means does NOT mean they aren't sweet, loving dogs. It means they are uncomfortable or scared. Take the time to meet each dog. Pet them while they are still in their kennel and let them get used to you for a few moments before you take him/her for a walk around the shelter ono-on-one. Once you get them home and they feel secure all will be well.

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped (with registration).

Would you consider becoming a foster for puppies, kittens and adult dogs and cats? Some just need a break from shelter life, some are awaiting their turn on a rescue transport, and some just need some love. If you feel that you cannot adopt at this time, think about a short- or long-term foster situation. Call the shelter to find out more information. It's a rewarding experience for everyone involved.
