

TOWN HALL RECAP

Last night the Tellico Village POA hosted a Townhall meeting at the Tellico Village Community church. Hundreds of villagers were in attendance as Board President, Bruce Johnson, Chuck James, a member of the Toqua Clubhouse committee, and Parker Owen, the POA CFO, gave presentations on the two proposed projects for the Kahite Annex replacement as well as the Toqua Clubhouse replacement. They covered proposed bids and plans in their presentations. Everyone in attendance expressed support for the projects. The event was recorded and the video as well as the PowerPoint Slides used will be posted to the POA website.

FAC MEETING AND BUDGET REVIEW 11/9

FAC Meeting 11/9 Review:

The Minutes from the previous meeting were approved unanimously. This was followed by the CFO's report on current activities. Parker Owen presented and updated the committee on the 2019 and 2020-2024 Five Year Plan. He also reviewed the actual budget vs. the projected budget to date. Housing starts and transfers are higher than budgeted creating more revenue in this area than budgeted. Year to date we are slightly under budget in total expenses, however underruns are set to catch up to us this month. Public Works overrun is due to maintenance on sewage and water lines. This trend will be reflected in the 2019 budget.

Current Village capital projects are a new Boiler-HVAC for the yacht club that cost roughly \$11,000 as well as a new Hot Water heater for the men's locker room at the wellness center that cost roughly, \$7, 975.00. These two projects were granted approval from the General Manager and appropriate department heads.

Budget Review:

Members of the FAC questioned the proposed price reduction on water and sewer connection fees from their other proposed price increase. The original proposal was set at \$1200 for water and \$2000 for sewage. The current proposed price is set at \$800 for water connection and \$1200 for sewage.

The point was made that this reduction was proposed to keep the Village competitive with other local competitors in the market.

UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The 2018 campaign is off and running and contributions are starting to flow into the treasurer. Thus far, about ten days after the contribution information was mailed to village residents, we are approaching 1/3 of the goal of \$100,000 with a collected total to date of \$31,732. Your donations assist in promoting health, education and, in some cases, provide basic needs and financial stability to residents of the county less fortunate. UNITED WAY HELPS THOSE WHO HELP THE ABUSED

Unfortunately, many of our fellow citizens, primarily women and children, are subjected to physical, sexual and mental abuse at the hands of coworkers, spouses and family members. Fortunately, for the victims of this abuse there are four agencies in Loudon County that are partnered with United Way that help mitigate the effects this abuse has on the victims. The four agencies are Iva's Place, the Kids First Child Advocacy Center (CAC), The Sexual Assault Center of East Tennessee, and Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of the Ninth Circuit Court. Each of these offers support to the victims in unique ways.

Iva's Place offers a safe-haven physical shelter for women and children who are subjected to abuse by a partner or family member. These shelters, either apartments or rooms, offer a safe, secure haven where victims can, without fear of further abuse, get their lives back together and eventually move back into the community. While sheltered, they are provided instruction in life skills such as budgeting, nutrition, and job searching.

The Kids First Child Advocacy Center (CAC) provides a multidisciplinary advocacy team to serve severely abused children in the 9th Judicial District. It provides school resource libraries used by teachers, counselors and social workers as they work with students and their caregivers to mitigate the effect of various forms of abuse on the learning process.

The Sexual Assault Center of east Tennessee, a subsidiary activity of the Helen Ross McNabb Center, provides sexual assault nurse examiners to assist victims in the immediate aftermath of rape; they also provide advocacy services, therapy to victims and education and outreach in the community.

Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) provides volunteers that are appointed by the Juvenile Judge to serve the best interest of children who, by virtue of their home environments, are at risk for or have been subjected to abuse and neglect and are being dealt with in the Juvenile Court system family courts. The CASA volunteer investigates and monitors the case providing judiciary reports and speaking at court hearings on behalf of the child, as necessary. A number of Tellico Village residents are trained CASA volunteers.

United Way provides funding to each of these agencies that permits them to offer a full-range of necessary services, some of which would be curtailed were it not for the funds provided by YOU and distributed through the United Way.

It is a fact that the support that is provided by United Way to agencies such as these four is so essential to the quality of life of our fellow citizens who are dealing with life threatening problems on an every-day basis. Your support goes directly toward helping these victims.



"Keep Christ in Christmas" is the theme of the Annual Madisonville Kiwanis Christmas Parade to be held Saturday, December 1st at 3:00 p.m. The parade will form on Anderson Drive by the Monroe Farmers Coop and travel North on College Street past the Court House and then follow the route from last year.

The Grand Marshalls are WVLT Channel 8 TV anchors Alan Williams and Casey Wheeless. Alan, a Knoxville native, has spent over 30 years in the broadcast business. He played football at the University of Florida and was drafted by the New York Jets as a punter. He and his wife Rebecca Jackson have five children. TOYS FOR TOTS



The children of Loudon County need your help!

This marks the *twenty-second* year for the Loudon County Sheriff's Department and Tellico Village Woodworkers Club's "Toys-for-Tots" program. The program helps put toys under Christmas trees for many disadvantaged children in our local communities.

In 2017, the Woodworkers Club had 14 teams and 70 individuals build over 500 wooden toys and collected an additional 600+ new toys generously donated by Tellico Village residents.

The Woodworkers Club and Loudon County Sheriff's Office is asking Villagers and County residents to help the children of Loudon County by donating new, store-bought toys.

Pre-addressed envelopes are available at each drop-off location for residents who would like to help older children by mailing a check directly to the Loudon County's Sheriff's Office. Cash donations to "Toys-for-Tots" help the Sheriff's office meet special gift needs, particularly for older children. Our residents came through generously last year with donations of over \$2,000.

Toy distribution is managed by the Loudon County Sheriff's office, led by Sheriff Tim Guider. Debbie Hines, his assistant, is the Toys-for-Tots Program Coordinator.

Since the programs' inception, club members have delivered to the County Sheriff's Office over 10,000 toys. These toys have ranged from wooden trucks, cars and airplanes, to elaborate jewelry boxes, wooden puzzles, doll cribs, music boxes, children's furniture, and circus trains, toddler pull toys, rocking horses, artist boxes, easels and many more hand crafted wooden toys.

Woodworker Club members have transformed their basements and garages into Santa workshops, creating wooden toys to make this a special Christmas for disadvantaged children in our area. Please help by donating a new, store-bought toy, or making a cash donation.

Presentation of all the wooden and donated toys to the Sheriff's Office will be made Thursday, December 6th at 7:00 PM at the Tellico Village Community Church. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to come and see the wide variety of toys that the Tellico Village Woodworkers have made. Toys will be on display starting at 5:00 PM.


