JANUARY BOARD WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

2019 Workshop Time Change: Rick Blough

Board Vice President Rick Blough proposed to change the order of the workshop so that the board has time to prepare for the public session of the meeting. This meeting workshop schedule will mirror that of the Board meetings. The workshop would still occur the same time every month but would start at 1:30 p.m. and the Executive session would occur in the morning prior to the meeting. Kahite and Toqua Project Update: Jeff Gagley

Kahite Annex: The annex is currently being dismantled and is scheduled to be relocated starting Jan. 21st. This should take three days to move and set back up. The following Monday, Mr. Gagley will notify the contractor Merit to proceed with construction.

Toqua Clubhouse: Is currently moving equipment to other restaurants for repurposing and storing the bigger pieces that will be reused after construction. The temporary proshop is being moved and set up January 21st- 23rd. Notice to proceed will be given to the contractor RTC on January 28th for the construction of the new Clubhouse. Between the 24th and 27th the fire department will be doing training in the Clubhouse (there will be no fire).

General Cardwell graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1984

with honors as a distinguished military graduate. He currently resides in Lenoir City. General Cardwell is a combat veteran and is currently serving as the Special Assistant for Reserve Matters to the Commander of the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD), as well as the the US Northern Command at Peterson Air Force Base, Colorado.

The Legion meeting was opened by The Tellico Village Singers, delighting members with singing some patriotic songs. MG Cardwell, in an excellent briefing, provided the Legion Members with some enlightening information about the current command structure and capabilities of those commands. He explained the new structures were updated as a result of 9/11, recent natural disasters, and the need for the security of large events. Points that highlighted the General's briefing: The commands monitor the movement of all nuclear weapons, monitor all civilian aircraft, monitor ship movements, and when anything is fired into the sky the government is aware of it and can track it. 

While you're there, please remember the dog or cat's true personality may not show through immediately in the shelter environment. Their kennel is now their "safe place" and some struggle a bit when removed from it. That, by no means does NOT mean they aren't sweet, loving dogs or cats. It simply means they are uncomfortable or scared. Take the time to meet each dog. Pet him or her while they are still in their kennel and let them get used to you for a few moments before you take him/her for a walk around the shelter one-on-one. Once you get them home and they feel secure all will be well. All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped (with registration).

Would you consider becoming a foster for puppies, kittens and adult dogs and cats? Some just need a break from shelter life, some are awaiting their turn on a rescue transport, and some just need some love. If you feel that you cannot adopt at this time, think about a short- or long-term foster situation. Call the shelter to find out more information. It's a rewarding experience for everyone involved.
