## **ADOPT A CLASS**



REGINA BENEDICT - Criminal Justice Proffesor at Maryville provides an overview of the justifications of punishment and how they relate to current practices within adult corrections; incarceration as a gendered experience by comparing male and female inmates and facilities; inmate subcultures and coping during incarceration and the prevalence of drugs and addiction within prisons and current practices of rehabilitation. Jasmine and Peanut are housemates. Jasmine is a 4½ year old DSH, white with a few black spots and Peanut is a 2-year-old brown tabby with white paws and a white bib. They are both very sweet and lovable girls-they like to be held, petted and rubbed. Jasmine is a talker and prefers quality canned food. It would be great for them and emotionally beneficial to go home together, but it is not necessary.

Looking for an independent feline? Spot is your guy! He has been described as slightly quiet and self-reliant but easy to handle. He's not a cuddly type kitty in his current situation, it's hard to tell in the shelter environment-he may turn out to be a happy, sun-spot napper once he's in a home. He likes chin scratches and head rubs when he's interested. He may be an excellent indoor/outdoor cat, (see info on the website under Barn Cat Program for how to acclimate an outdoor cat to a new home www.monroecountyfriendsofanimals.org)

Preliminary statistics for 2018 for cats are looking good! Intake is down (especially kittens and puppies under 6 months old), adoptions were up, and we had many more cats going to rescues last year! Everyone has been working very hard to educate the public about Spay and Neuter and it's working! Between vouchers sessions sponsored by SNAP and vouchers sponsored by Monroe County Friends of Animals many thousands of animals were not born this year and did not have to be turned into the shelter.

There are not a lot of rescue organizations that take cats. (another volunteer opportunity-help us find more (close) cat rescue's!). We have a rescue in the north that accepts kittens, but we have to operate and pay for the transport. Finding drivers (team) to make this 2-day run is a volunteer opportunity that we are looking to fill. We would like to do a run at least once per month-maybe twice in the summer months. The MCFA van is available for this purpose, (THANK YOU PetSmart Charities!!!!) no personal vehicle needs to be used. The more drivers we have, the less often a team needs to make the run.
