BOARD WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

The March Board Workshop was held on March 5, 2019.

Timeless Tellico Foundation: Simon Bradbury

The Timeless Tellico Foundation's purpose is to raise funds to improve, enhance, maintain, and benefit facilities and amenities in Tellico Village. Paperwork has been submitted to the Secretary of State for the foundation to be approved as a non-profit corporation, as well as paperwork to the IRS to become a 501c3 independent entity. A response is expected within 30 days. Simon requested the Board approve the foundation and allow him to move forward. The next step will be to select a board of 7 trustees that will be chaired by Simon for a maximum of 2 years until he feels it is stable enough that he can step down.

The Board voted to approve 6-0.

UPDATE: TOQUA CLUBHOUSE & KAHITE COMMUNITY CENTER

TOQUA: Construction is about 2 weeks behind schedule due to heavy rainfall. Additionally, construction crews hit a snag when they discovered a primary direct line buried under the left front corner and under the front columns. Loudon Utility Board was notified to correct the issue. For the time being, progress is at a standstill while waiting for LUB.

KAHITE: The footers and columns have been dug and concrete has been poured. They are a few days behind, but progress remains on schedule and on budget.


LOUDON COUNTY CLERK

ROSS GAP/FROZEN HEAD STATE PARK (loop)

Distance: 7.5 miles Rating: Difficult

This hike is in Frozen Head State Park near Wartburg, TN. We will combine the Ross Gap, Cumberland, and Bird Mountain trails. The hike will depart the campground and follow the road to the beginning of Ross Gap trail. The trail climbs steadily about 1200 feet to the intersection with the Cumberland trail. There is evidence of mining along the trail and we will make an interesting rock crossing. When the Cumberland trail meets the Bird Mountain trail, we will make a slight detour to explore Castle Rock. Bird Mountain trail descends steadily back to the cars to complete the loop.



Because of his influence, the Men's and Women's SEC Athlete of the Year Award is presented annually as the Roy F. Kramer Award.



Roy is a dynamic speaker with great stories to share and is well-loved by all who have worked with him. Even in his retirement years, current SEC coaches and athletic directors continue to seek his advice and counsel. This will be a rare opportunity to meet and hear from one of the college sports pioneers who helped elevate the SEC conference to what it is today.

Rosie is an 18-month-old black and brown shepherd/ collie mix who weighs about 40 pounds. As a young adult, Rosie is full grown but still has a playful puppy personality. She came from a local family home and farm and loves to run and play with children. Rosie was surrendered due to her love of eggs and unfortunate habit of stealing those eggs directly from the chickens before the family could collect them. She is spayed and ready to bond with a new family.

Is your dog going crazy being cooped up inside during all the rain? Here are a couple ideas for active, indoor games that will exercise your dog both mentally and physically.

1. Set up 4-5 boxes upside down with a treat in one of the boxes. Encourage your dog to sniff out the treat.

When he finds it, enthusiastically praise him and allow him to eat the treat. This will help encourage him to use his sense of smell often.

2. Tag, you're it! You'll need a partner for this game. Each of you gets a pocket full of treats and start on opposite sides of the room. One person calls the dog and rewards him with a treat, then the next person calls and rewards. Move further apart so that soon you're calling from different rooms, and then from all the way across the house. The more your dog runs around the house, the better!
