HIGHWAY 321 CONSTRUCTION

T.D.O.T. has indicated the Highway 321 project has been delayed due to unforeseen situations including unknown underground utilities, design changes, sinkholes, AT&T scheduling of relocated lines, and weather. The prime contractor expects completion on or before October 31, 2019. The intersection of US 321 and US 11 is expected to be returned to two through lanes by the end of summer. Both north and southbound traffic along US 321 are being shifted to the outside to allow the contractor to proceed with work along the center of the highway. Please be vigilant in the construction zone.



ROAD SURVEY

As of Monday, April 1st, the TVPOA's Public Works Department is conducting a survey of all the roads in the Village. The roads survey will be used to determine the condition of the roads so that we can make the best choices about what kinds of maintenance is needed to preserve, maintain, and repair the roads at the lowest overall cost now and in the future.

The survey is being performed by S&ME, Inc., who has an office in nearby Louisville, TN. The survey trucks have the S&ME logo and have a flashing amber light on the top. These trucks will be traveling slowly through each neighborhood, stopping periodically to measure and photograph the roads.

- 3. Each contestant can enter up to four photos in total.



This is one of the most lovely and popular trails in the park. The trail follows the Ramsey Prong of the Little Pigeon River and passes by many waterfalls and rapids. It ends at a beautiful 100-foot cascade, the highest waterfall in the Smokies. We will pass through one of the only old growth forest areas in the park. Almost all of the Smokies were logged so it is amazing to see the size of the original poplars and imagine the whole of the Smokies forested by such magnificent trees. Because of the elevation gain and the rocky trail, we have rated this hike as difficult.

Mouse Creek Falls is a great waterfall hike in a scenic area of the Smoky National Park east of Gatlinburg across the North Carolina border. It is a bit of drive but introduces you to a different part of the park. We will hike in about 2 miles along Big Creek on an old railroad grade (wide with a moderate slope) lined with Rhododendrons, trees, and wet rock formations. We will not be doing any stream crossings, though there may be some very small water runoffs crossing the trail. We will stop along the way to observe the creek cascade over rocks and large boulders as we make our way to Mouse Falls, which has a 45-foot drop. After observing the falls we will continue on for another ½ mile to a foot bridge overlooking the creek, stop for lunch, then return to our starting point.

Hiking boots and poles are recommended. Bring water and lunch for on the trail. We suggest you bring an extra pair of shoes and place dirty hiking boots in a trash bag to keep the driver's car clean. In the event of a situation requiring medical intervention, we suggest each participant wear their name tag and bring a Photo ID and medical information cards.





"We don't think of shelter cats and dogs as any different from pet cats and dogs; except that yesterday they were a pet and today they're in a shelter, and their behavior may not really reflect who they were in that previous home."

Hi, I'm Cole! I am a small handsome boy with a stub tail and chubby cheeks. I love when people scratch my cheeks, back and the base of my little tail. They say I'm about 2½ years old. I get fed canned food twice per day and I can graze on dry food anytime along with clean, fresh water every day. I knew what to do with a litter box from the first moment. I am feeling more confident and learning new things every day. I have discovered sleeping under the covers on the bed. Are you able to give me the time to learn a new person and a new home with new rules? I would do best in a home without children (they move too fast for me). My foster mom doesn't know if I get along with other cats and dogs. I have been neutered, microchipped, and am up to date on vaccinations and flea/heartworm/earmite preventive.

Cole is currently residing in a foster home. Please contact the shelter at 423-442-1015 to arrange a meet and greet.

All animals that are adopted are spayed or neutered, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped with registration. Cats are litter box trained. \$40 adoption fee over 2 years old; \$50 under 2 years old.

Shelter needs: Pedigree dog and puppy canned and dry food, Friskies canned pate flavors, Purina One dry cat and kitten food. All funds are used for animal care including veterinarian fees, antibiotics, testing, vaccinations, flea and heartworm control, cat litter, and sanitary litter boxes.

Shelter statistics for last week: Intakes- 28; Shelter adoptions- 6; Transferred to rescue- 40, and 1 gorgeous cat returned to owner (and now microchipped).
