Our Tellico Village community has a wonderful history of supporting amenities throughout the Village. This is beneficial to us as property owners, as the first two considerations of those choosing a retirement community are location and amenities. The high-quality amenities in Tellico Village, such as our three beautifully maintained golf courses, continue to have a positive impact on our quality of life and property values.

Some of us were here in 2007 when Tellico Village was primarily a golfing community, while others are newer residents who may not be golfers, creating a more diverse population. We have grown from being a golfing community of 4,000 residents and three golf courses to a community with 8,000 residents who participate in a wide variety of activities supported by Tellico Village. While our population is steadily growing, some Villagers who played golf three to four times per week are no longer with us or have reached an age at which sustaining that level of participation is no longer feasible.

Several current Board members are golfers who have lived in Tellico Village for many years. We played through the Toqua greens rebuild in 2007/2008 and the death of the Toqua and Tanasi greens in 2010. Since then, we've seen a remarkable improvement with the hiring of course superintendents Chris

Sykes, Wells McClure, and Jordan Clark, who have performed an outstanding job on our golf courses and bring extraordinary value to our golfing experience. Jeff Harrington, Casey Flenniken, and Charles Roffers, along with Jim West and Adam Jacob, are excellent golf pros who handle our leagues, tournaments, special events, requests, complaints, and ideas while keeping smiles on their faces and continuing to teach us how to improve our golf game. When comparing the price and course condition of our Toqua, Tanasi, and Kahite courses to any other community course, we're confident our Tellico Village golf experience and value is far superior.

If you appreciate the golf amenity in Tellico Village, it is important that we support it over surrounding courses outside of the Village. This means that we will occasionally play Tellico Village courses at tee times that differ from our regular schedules (especially during peak season) and in varying conditions (like during aeration weeks). Supporting our home courses sometimes requires flexibility, but utilizing this major amenity and filling tee times maximizes revenue. This avoids pitfalls that can occur when assets are not utilized to potential (causing waste and cost overruns), requiring the asset expenses to be brought in line with reduced revenues. In the case of golf, this could affect the courses' quality.

We are working diligently to keep our golf amenity desirable and cost effective. Last year, a pricing update was implemented to allow Villagers to sign up for pre-paid programs to help control user fees. Unlimited golf rates were also reduced, and an unlimited pre-paid program for afternoon golf was introduced. Golf rates per round were increased by \$1, which can be offset by using a pre-paid account.

As you have (hopefully) heard, our golf staff is in the process of implementing several non-traditional golfing activities and events to appeal to all residents in our diverse community, even non-golfers. To be clear, our golf department is financially healthy, but we are always looking for new ways to increase participation. Please show your support by playing on our courses and as always, let us know how we can better serve this community.

HELP US KEEP OUR SEWER SYSTEM CLEAN

Everything you put down your toilet, garbage disposal, and sink goes through your plumbing and effluent pump system, then is sent to the sewer system before ending up at the local wastewater treatment plant. The Public Works Department handles the sewer system for the Village, and their team has recently encountered several unsavory issues caused by incorrect waste disposal.

Anything that is not biodegradable, such as plastic and cardboard tampon applicators, condoms, and heavy paper products like paper towels and baby wipes, should go in the trash. This kind of waste can cause clogs in the pumps that can end up costing homeowners an extra maintenance fee.

Grease also causes big problems for the sewage system; grease should be poured in a can and disposed of in the trash once solidified. Once grease passes through the individual sewage pumps, it begins to cake up in the lift stations.

To help break down buildup, control odors, and keep your plumbing and septic systems working efficiently, it is recommended to flush Rid-x in your toilets once a month.

"We've got a good sewer system, we just need to take care of it," says Glen Quillen, Public Works Water and Sewer Manager.

Please help us maintain our sewers and keep the Village (and the environment!) clean and smelling great!

HIGHWAY 321 CONSTRUCTION

T.D.O.T. has indicated the Highway 321 project has been delayed due to unforeseen situations including unknown underground utilities, design changes, sinkholes, AT&T scheduling of relocated lines, and weather. The prime contractor expects completion on or before October 31, 2019. The intersection of US 321 and US 11 is expected to be returned to two through lanes by the end of summer. Both north and southbound traffic along US 321 are being shifted to the outside to allow the contractor to proceed with work along the center of the highway. Please be vigilant in the construction zone.




MEN'S GOLF

TELLICO COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

Do you have expired prescriptions in your medicine or kitchen cabinets? What about that prescription you never quite finished, is it in a bathroom vanity drawer or on your bedroom night stand?

On Saturday, April 27 from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. Tellico Villagers will have a chance to turn in their expired and unused prescriptions at the Welcome Center. Needles, prescription liquids and syringes will not be accepted.

This first local "Take Back Day" is jointly sponsored by the Tellico Community Foundation along with the Prevention Alliance of Loudon County and Align9. The United States Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) sponsors the overall event nationally. Last fall, Americans turned in nearly 460 tons (more than 900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at more than 5,800 DEA sponsored sites.

The objective of the event is to provide a safe, convenient location to dispose of opioids and other medications and to raise awareness about the potential risks of abusing drugs. Residents will also receive information from "Count it! Lock it! Drop it!" which is an initiative funded in part by the BlueCross Blue Shield of Tennessee Health Foundation that works to empower and educate individuals on how they can prevent prescription drug misuse.

Villagers can drop off their unwanted drugs at the Welcome Center at 202 Chota Road. The take back activity will be supervised by local law enforcement officials. Representatives from the Tellico Village Lions Club will be on hand to retrieve the discarded pill bottles. The Lions Club has been engaged in recovering plastic containers used to store medical type products, vitamins and OTC drugs. The collected containers are then sent to an organization in Ohio which repurposes them for prescription use in third world countries.


