SMOKY MOUNTAIN SERVICE DOGS

There's a new way to support Smoky Mountain Service Dogs and let fellow motorists know you're doing so! Smoky Mountain Service Dogs is pre-selling custom license plates to Tennessee residents with registered vehicles. The plate costs \$35.00 but \$15.37 of the cost benefits the organization directly.

The state requires a minimum of 1,000 pre-orders to start production of the new plate. After all orders are received, it will take four to six months for plates to arrive at local county clerk offices.



Reserved seats at \$21 for the renowned Tennessee Williams drama *The Glass Menagerie* are on sale on the Tellico Community Players website – www.TellicoCommunityPlayhouse.org. (Click on tickets to purchase.)

Dates for this third Tellico Community Players performance of 2019 are Thursday – Saturday, June 13 – 15 and Thursday – Sunday June 20 – 23. All shows begin at 7:30 p.m., except for the matinee Sunday, June 23, which begins at 1:30 p.m.

One of the most famous plays of the modern theatre, *The Glass Menagerie*, has been described as a drama of great tenderness, charm and beauty. In its initial opening in Chicago in 1944, the play was not expected to last long, but the critics loved it and gave it rave reviews. When it opened in New York in 1945, the cast received an unbeatable 25 curtain calls.

The play is introduced to the audience by Tom, the narrator and protagonist, as a play based on memory. Tom cautions the audience that what they see may not be precisely what happened. Amanda Wingfield, a faded Southern Belle of middle age, shares a dingy St. Louis apartment with her son, Tom, and his slightly older sister, Laura. In *The Glass Menagerie*, the themes of illusions and impossible dreams offer an escape from reality, but they cannot be sustained. The past informs the present, and the possibility of escaping the past is only an illusion.

James Fisher is directing, and Len Willis is producing The Glass Menagerie. Sponsor of the show is Warren Jackson, CPA.

PET OF THE WEEK:

Jordan is a smart, sweet, and goofy girl. She is a brindle/white pitbull/terrier mix who is about 4.5 years old and weighs 57 pounds. Miss Jordan came to us with some injuries but is fully healed and looking for her forever home. She was previously in a home where we were told the other dog became aggressive with her, and we are recommending that she is placed in a home without other pets. She loves children but because of her size and energy level, she would do best with older children. Jordan is very social and likes to snuggle. She walks very nicely on a leash, loves to greet people, and play ball.

Animals' true personalities may not show through immediately in the shelter environment. They may consider their kennel a safe place and be uncomfortable when taken out. This doesn't mean they aren't sweet, loving dogs. It just means they are unsure or scared in this environment. Take some time to meet each dog. Let them get used to you for a few



moments before you take him/her for a walk around the shelter grounds. Once you get your new pet home, allow them time to become adjusted to their new life. Depending on their background, living in a home may be a new experience for them. This may not happen overnight, so be patient and you will end up with a happy, well-adjusted pet.

Consider becoming a foster for puppies, kittens and adult dogs and cats. Some just need a break from shelter life, some are awaiting their turn on a rescue transport, and some just need some love. If you feel that you cannot adopt at this time, consider a short- or long-term foster situation. Call the shelter to learn more information.

Please consider offering a foster home to help the pets at Second Chance Pals (SCP), a program of Monroe County Friends of Animals. These foster homes help older and/or sick pets that need more assistance than the typical homeless pet. They often cannot be treated until they have a foster home commitment where they can safely stay until their recovery needs are met. Veterinary care and expenses are provided for their treatments and they are closely monitored.

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, wormed, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped with registration. Cats are litter box trained. \$50 adoption fee over 1 year old, \$60 under 1 year old.

The Monroe County Animal Shelter is located at 170 Kefauver Lane in Madisonville (behind Wal-Mart) and is open Tuesday – Friday from 11 – 4:30 and Saturdays from 11 – 2. The shelter is closed to the public on Sunday and Monday. Call 423-442-1015 and check out all available pets on our website at www. monroecountyfriendsofanimals.org. TN Monroe County Animal Shelter is the official Facebook page for the Monroe County Animal Shelter.
