PSAC HIGHLIGHTS

The Public Services Advisory Committee met on Wednesday, July 3rd. The minutes from the June 5th meeting were approved.

Public Works: Chad Johnson

- To date, 384 tanks have been replaced.
- Boat docks have been inspected and determined to need a few things repaired. The POA will be meeting with the contractor this week.

Roads and Grounds: Clayton Taylor

- Clearing trees from roadways, common properties, yards, etc.
- General cleanup following rain and storms
- HA5 is moving along well and is estimated to wrap up by mid-August (accounting for possible future weather delays). We have an inspector on site every day to monitor the work being done.

Updates and Current Procurements: Jeff Gagley

- Both construction projects remain on time, however, the construction of the Kahite Community Center has progressed more slowly than we'd hoped.
- The roads study is complete and the POA was scheduled to meet with S&ME on July 8th to review the report. S&ME will be at the July 17th Board meeting to present the report.

- Due to the storm on Friday, June 28th, part of the roof of the Wellness Center was damaged. The pool has been cleaned and the area has been deemed safe. We are still waiting on the insurance adjuster to determine the specifics of repair/replacement.
- The low water pressure issue has recently improved with the use of the booster pump on the south end of the Village to help keep the water tank at an adequate level. We began this about two weeks ago and believe it is the easiest solution for the time being with our existing infrastructure.

UPDATE: TOQUA CLUBHOUSE AND KAHITE COMMUNITY CENTER



Twentymile is one of the Smokies' most remote areas. You'll travel along Twentymile Creek on an old railroad grade, past Twentymile Cascades, up to the Appalachian Trail and Shuckstack Mountain, and finally to a fire tower that offers a 360-degree panorama. While the first three miles of the trail from the ranger station are generally easy, there will be some strenuous climbing for the last two miles.

Note: this hike requires driving the Tail of the Dragon, US Hwy. 129, and some hikers have developed motion sickness on this road.

India is gray/white with gorgeous markings (and her sister Asia is a long-hair gray/white). Both were brought in with their litters of kittens. Both were underweight (common with nursing mamas-- it takes a lot of calories to feed those babies) and scraggly but are filling out nicely. (Asia will be available soon, she needs to gain some more weight). India is very talkative, social and sweet and enjoys petting and scratches. She would need to warm up a bit before being picked up and held. Adopt India now and Asia in a few weeks? They would be best friends and sisters!

We are in need of foster homes for cats and kittens! It takes ALL of us to save and rescue them.

The Monroe County Animal Shelter (MCAS) operates a monthly food pantry to help pet families in Monroe County. Our supplies are low and we need your help. The shelther needs: Pedigree dog and puppy canned and dry food, Friskies canned pate flavors, and Purina One dry cat and kitten food. Donations vial PayPal can be made from our website (www.monroecountyfriendsofanimals.org) or checks may be mailed to MCFA, PO Box 106, Vonore, TN 37885. All funds are used for animal care, including veterinarian fees, antibiotics, testing, vaccinations, flea and heartworm control, cat litter, and sanitary litter boxes.Donations can be dropped off at the shelter during open business hours. In addition, the Food City in Vonore has a donation barrel by the customer service desk/self-check-out area for convenience of purchasing supplies and leaving them at the store. Thank you for your kindness and support.

All animals adopted are spayed or neutered, wormed, have age appropriate vaccinations and testing, and are microchipped with registration. Cats are litter box trained. \$50 adoption fee over 1 year old, \$60 under 1 year old.

The Monroe County Animal Shelter is located at 170 Kefauver Lane in Madisonville (behind Wal-Mart) and is open Tuesday – Friday from 11 – 4:30 and Saturdays from 11 – 2.
