#### **PSAC HIGHLIGHTS**

The Public Services Advisory Committee met on Wednesday, August 7, 2019.

#### **Public Works Update (Glen Quillen):**

- 482 tanks have been modified to date; the cost to modify each tank is \$75
- Bruce Johnson suggested the tank modification project be bid out as a project, with a 9 month to 1 year time limit
- It costs the POA between \$5000-\$7500, per storm event, for storm water that leaks into the tanks
- · 23 meters and 15 sewer tanks were installed; 28 water leaks and 24 sewer leaks were repaired

- · LED bulbs were installed on F&G docks; H&I are to be done
- The sewer tank was installed at the Kahite clubhouse

#### Roads and Grounds (Jeff Gagley):

- Continue to remove trees from the storm damage
- Continue to work on drainage issues
- HA5 is complete; touch up is scheduled for August 21st; this process will be reviewed for what was good and things needing improvement
- Received the report regarding the core sample taken from Chota Road, which is already showing signs of failure; responsibility for this is now an issue
- The milling and paving of Kahite Trail is scheduled to begin in mid-September

#### Wellness Center Roof (Bud Murray):

- Roof replacement contract back out for bid.
- Comprehensive repair storm damage and replace roof.
- Still evaluating both metal and shingle options.
- Still includes interior painting.
- · Bid due back August 23rd.

#### **CAC HIGHLIGHTS**

The Communications Advisory Committee met on August 9th. George Curran was voted as Vice Chair and welcomed Tim Rasmussen (TVB) to the committee.

## Goals 2019 Update and Assignments: Beth Kuberka

- Crisis Communications Plan is finished.
- Communications Policy was approved by the Board in the Executive session with minor changes and will be officially approved at the next Board meeting.
- Communications Plan will be finalized this month and sent to Winston, managers, and directors for review
- Style Guide will be a work in progress because of the logo design. We are working with a graphic designer on minor revisions.

## **Communications and Marketing Report: Beth Kuberka**

- Developed a plan to reduced tour time to 1 hour for walk-ins; implemented a mass text system to secure tour guides
- Leads, discovery requests, completed tours, walkin tours, Welcome Center traffic have all increased from July last year
- Second Quarter Newsletter is at the printer, digital version went out on Aug 9th.
- Kahite Community Center grand opening: August 15th at 10 a.m. followed by a reception and tour Open House until 1 p.m. Hors d'oeuvres will be served.
- Created a directory page on Tellico Life for a comprehensive list of all clubs with contact info,




#### **ADOPT-A-CLASS**
