FALL FESTIVAL

CarFit is an educational program sponsored by AAA, AARP, and AOTA that offers older adults the opportunity to check how their personal vehicles fit them. FIND YOUR FIT

To help senior drivers find a better “fit” with their vehicles for comfort and safety, STAYinTV and Tellico Village University are sponsoring CarFit, a safety program designed to help older drivers and their families.

The Tellico Village program will take place from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Friday, October 25th at the Lakeside Real Estate parking lot, across from the Marathon station. Admission is free.

The CarFit program is being conducted in conjunction with the POA's 3rd annual Fall Festival, which is being held in the Tellico Village Community Church parking lot the same day.



CarFit was developed nationally by AAA, AARP, and the American Occupational Therapy Association. It's designed to give a quick, yet comprehensive check on how well an older driver and their vehicle work together.

“As we age, changes in our vision, flexibility, strength, range of motion and even size and height may make us less comfortable and reduce our control behind the wheel,” said Bill Hartman, chair of the event. “CarFit provides older adults with the tools to understand and apply the safety features of their car.”

At the CarFit event, trained volunteers will complete a 12-point checklist with each driver. Items checked will include correct position of driver's seat, driver's ability to easily reach pedals and proper adjustment of mirrors.

A Matlock Tire representative will be on hand to check vehicles' tire pressure and fluid levels.

Occupational therapists also will be there to provide consultation, if needed, that can teach drivers how to maintain and improve aspects related to their driving health. The therapist also can provide information to participants addressing individual needs, including information about local community resources on exercise, nutrition and other programs to help keep them safe on the road.

“It is critically important that mature drivers make safety a personal priority,” said Hartman. “Driving today is more difficult than ever because of increased traffic congestion, longer commute distances, new technology and faster speeds. Older drivers can take important measures to mitigate the stress associated with driving.”

Older drivers also can check with their local AAA club or AARP office to take a driver safety refresher course for older road users or look into occupational therapy driving evaluation programs for individualized assessments and recommendations. CarFit represents an extension of those classroom programs, and an opportunity for older drivers to make sure their personal vehicles are adjusted to their needs.

WASTEWATER TANK MODIFICATIONS

It has come to our attention that Villagers have some concerns about our residential wastewater tank modifications, and that these modifications may increase odors at the tank. The truth is, these modifications will reduce odors near the tank. These modifications are designed to help our Village during heavy rain events.

The original design of these tanks allows them to vent through the cap at ground level to let air in and out as the liquid level in the tank rises and falls. We have learned that in heavy rains, the vents are also allowing rainwater to enter the tank. With almost 5,000 tanks throughout the Village, this quickly overwhelms our sewer system and causes problems.

We scheduled the tank modifications according to past issues. We began with the residents who have the most sewer alarms during heavy rain events. Our goal is to eventually modify every wastewater tank in Tellico Village. When the lid is removed, we use an inch-wide rubber foam seal that has adhesive on one side. We place the seal around the edge of the lid that will press against the edge of the riser when secured. Then, we dig a hole on the outside of the riser that we will place the 1¼" check valve. The hole will be big enough to place a 6-inch diameter valve box that will protect the check valve. The check valve is connected to the inside of the riser and was selected to prevent fumes and odors from escaping but will open if liquids are present. This will allow the system to release when a failure of the pump system occurs, allowing liquid to escape the tank and not back up into the home. This modification will force fumes and odors to escape via the roof vents in each home. With the seal around the lid, the gases escaping from the tank will be limited or eliminated.

While we are performing the modification, we also perform a 23-point inspection on the entire system. The inspection consists of checking sludge levels, floats, ball valves, check valves, pump pressure, and line pressure. We log any issues that we find so they can be addressed as needed.

Our goal is to serve Tellico Village to the best of our ability. We want to be safe and efficient in all our actions. We want to assure each of you that your best interests are the standard in which we serve. PET OF THE WEEK:



This week's trio of fabulous, furry felines are striped tabbies. Tabby is not a breed of cat; it is a coat pattern. Tabby cats with stripes patterns are often called "tigers." When it comes to personality traits, tabbies are considered friendly, happy-go-lucky cats, intelligent, sassy, very affectionate and wonderful companions. While tabbies do love a nap, they also love playtime and should get regular exercise.

Sassy Jo is a 2-year-old female brown tabby with white markings. She was an outdoor cat that was showing signs that she wanted to be an indoor cat. She is a cat that winds around your legs and that was dangerous for her elderly caregiver. Cats will wind between your legs when they want something and are excited about it. A prime example is feeding time. The moving between and rubbing against the legs is called marking, and happens when they are excited. This is a trait that can easily be controlled/fixed. Most often, it is an indication that the cat wants attention. Sassy Jo is a fantastic hunter that loves to show off her trophies of mice, moles, and other nuisance animals. She is afraid of children and wary of most male humans.

Elaine is a 1-year-old female torbie (Tortishell/Tabby mix). She was brought in to the shelter with a kitten as a stray. Elaine is a very friendly and personable cat that always has a smile on her face and is always purring. She is very outgoing and actively pursues human affection. She had probably been someone's pet at one time.

Trixie is a 4-year-old gorgeous, red torbie. She was an outdoor cat that the caregiver was feeding for the past 3+ years. She has adjusted very well to being inside the shelter and would make a perfect indoor/outdoor cat. Trixie is very sweet, though a bit reserved and quiet (probably a bit distressed at her new situation).

Cat Tidbits: A cat has the ability to rotate their ears 180 degrees—with the help of 32 muscles that they use to control them. Unlike humans, cats are usually lefties. Studies indicate that their left paw is typically their dominant paw. A cat's nose is as unique as a human's fingerprint.
