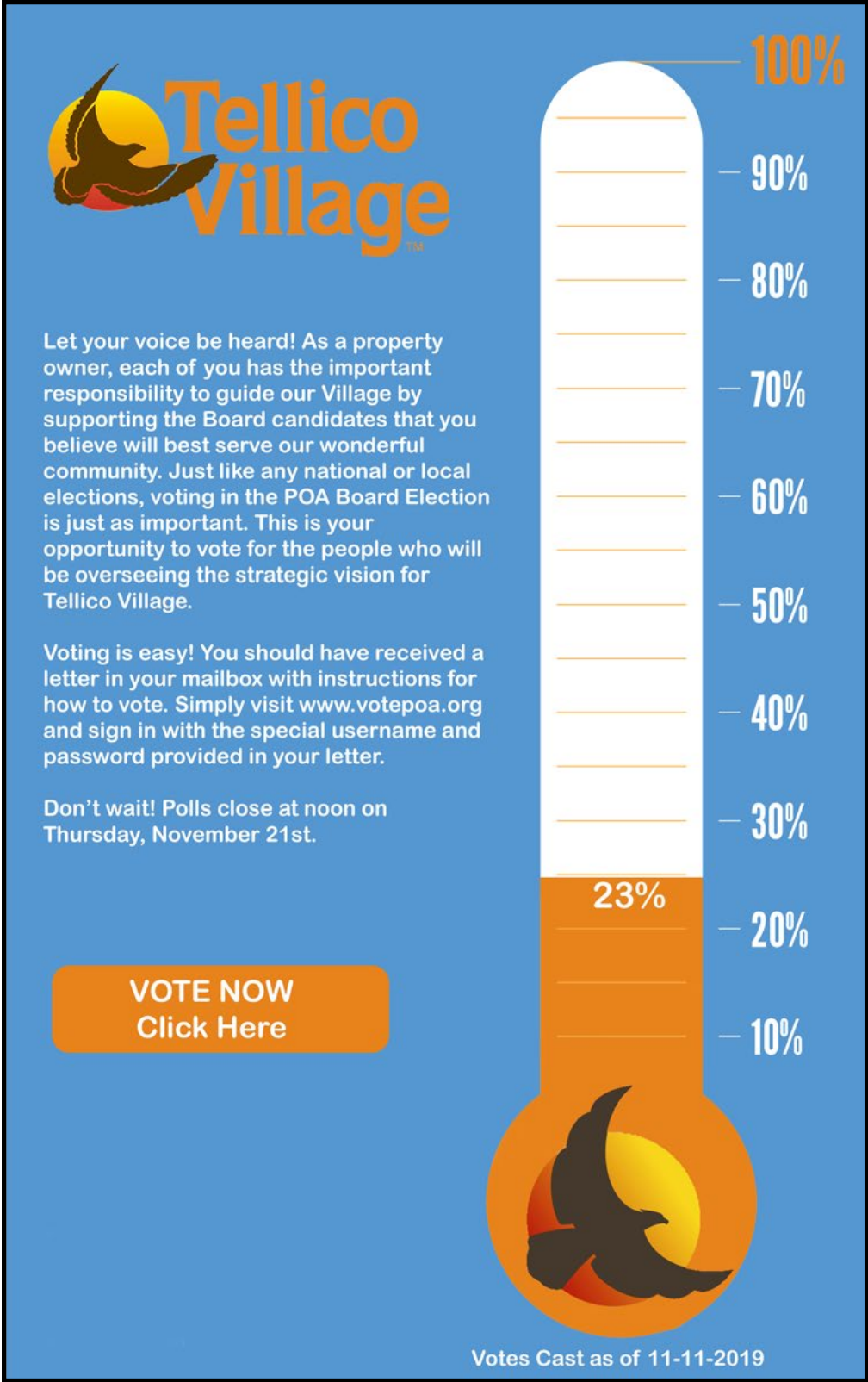

NEW TELLICO VILLAGE VISION STATEMENT

Please note: the November LRPAC Committee Meeting previously scheduled for Thanksgiving Day has been rescheduled to November 14th at 1 p.m. in the POA Conference Room.

On November 5th, the Tellico Village Board of Directors accepted the 2019 Long Range Strategic Plan and approved the new Tellico Village Vision Statement.

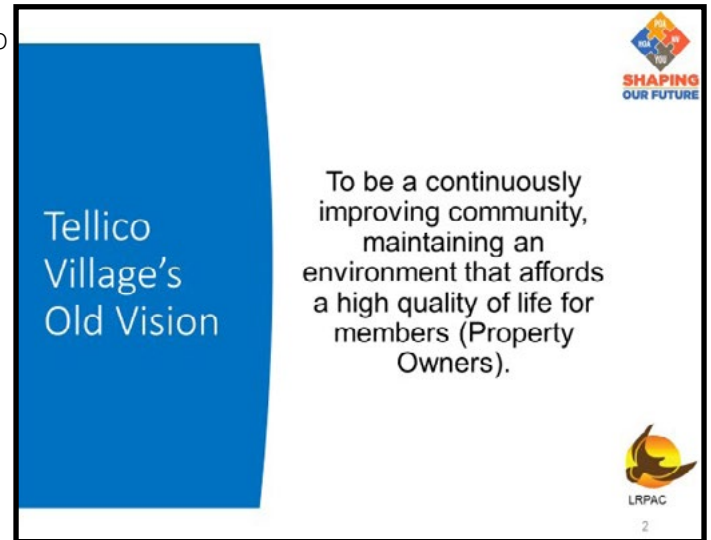
The old vision shown here, was originally approved in 2005 and revised in 2012. As part of the input methodology for the new strategic plan, the LRPAC empaneled 2 focus groups to review the current vision and if warranted to propose a new vision. Each focus group was 4 hours long, made up of 12 randomly selected individuals, matching the demographics of the Shaping Our Future Questionnaire, and facilitated by trained facilitators.

In general, the focus groups recognized that the old Tellico Village vision statement was wanting

- as a vision statement on its own,
- as being dated,
- as not being inspirational,
- with no reference to financials,
- as a tool to support marketing, and
- as a yardstick to gauge long range planning for Tellico Village.

Participants quickly zeroed in on these essentials for a new vision

- a strongly connected sense of community,
- financial stability,
- meeting the changing needs of Villagers and
- having something for all.



The two focus groups each proposed a new vision statement that the LRPAC combined into this new approved Tellico Village Mutually Shared Vision.

Let's reflect on these words and their meaning:

Dynamic and Engaging – exciting, vibrant, welcoming – like we all felt when we arrived here. Our Social Fabric – it's why we stay.

Changing Needs - All of us have invested a significant portion of our lifetime's accumulated net worth in this community. We are as they say, "all in". We all came here with a vision, but our needs will change over time. We must meet the needs of all our property owners as they pass through the different stages of their lives.

Fiscally Responsible Manner - Village finances were by far the number one issue on Villagers' minds and we believe village finances will continue to be number one. Our financial strength is what sets us apart.

Lifetime of Wellbeing – for most of us, this will really be our "forever home"

We believe this new vision statement will serve us well in measuring our progress, marketing our village, and guiding us to the future. It may have a different meaning for all of us but by discussing it, thinking about it, and internalizing it, we can give it life and make this mutually shared vision come true.

RUMBLE ON THE RIVER

Cool temperatures and fog greeted 72 players showing up to Tanasi golf course at 7:15 a.m. to register for the 36 hole Disc Golf Hybrid event. Most disc golf events are hosted on sites with permanent baskets in place, like Victor Ashe Park, The Claytons, The Mounds, Admiral Farragut or Morningside Park. What makes the hybrid events unique is the beautifully manicured golf course and views, coupled with temporary baskets set out in challenging areas.

With a full field of players, four on each hole to begin, and a plethora of different skill levels playing, we "shotgun" started at 8:45. Players were required to walk the course, so giving them ample time to make it to their starting holes was necessary.

After the first wave of play was completed around noon, players were able to grab a box lunch with hot dogs, chips and a drink from the Tanasi Bar & Grill before the second round commenced.

The morning wave showed some scorching hot scores, with the leader in the pro division, Joey Lutz, shooting an impressive 9 under par 48. There were a lot of low scores considering the cold and foggy conditions to start the round, but with the wind laying down, the players made their way around the new course in formidable fashion. It was a tight race in every division halfway through play, and with the second-round set to go at 1:15pm the wind decided to show up for the afternoon play.



A quick reshuffle of players for the next tee off at 1:15, and they would head back out to their designated holes to resume the final 18 holes. Low scored continued throughout the second round, as players made their way towards the finish line. Taking home first place in the Pro division, was first round leader Joey Lutz, besting his 9 under first round with an even more impressive 11 under second round. He takes home the \$238 check along with the first Rumble on the River title.

The club was able to bring in \$8 per player for greens fees, and an additional \$5 each for a box lunch for 80 people, bringing our total to \$976 on a day which saw cold temperatures, and Tennessee Volunteer Homecoming game. We brought in other possible ball golf players, showcasing the beautiful property Tanasi has to offer, and utilized the course on a day which would have seen minimal play. The players had all positive comments on the beautiful course and views and are eager to play it again.

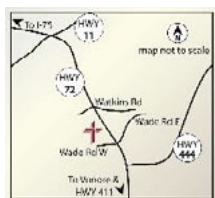

PET OF THE WEEK:



Lyla is a beautiful girl who believes in enjoying life to the fullest. She is a whirling dervish of activity and can be a bit messy but it is all part of her lovely charm! Lyla has tested FIV+ but that is no reason to pass her by! She would make a fantastic only cat or would be a great addition to any home where any other cats are already altered. She can live a very long, happy healthy life in the right home. She must be an INDOOR ONLY cat. FIV positive cats can live with negative cats as long all are fixed and not aggressive. Lyla is spayed, wormed, vaccinated and microchipped...her bag is packed and she's waiting for you! She is a silver-gray DSH about 16 months old.

FIV FACTS from Bestfriends.org: The most common route of infection is a deep bite wound from an FIV-positive cat to another cat. It can also be transmitted via blood, in utero, and from the milk of an infected mother cat. It is very rare for cats to get FIV just from being around infected cats, sharing food bowls, or from a person touching an FIV-positive cat and then touching an FIV-negative cat. Many FIV-positive cats and FIV-negative cats live together in the same home for years without spreading the virus to the non-infected cats.

There are no specific signs of FIV infection. FIV-positive cats have a weaker immune system, so they are more prone to getting infections, such as upper respiratory infections, ringworm and dental disease. Other than that, FIV-positive cats tend to live normal lives in a stress free environment and have a normal length of life. FIV cannot be transmitted to humans or dogs.

Can FIV-negative and FIV-positive cats live together? Yes, as long as the cats get along and do not fight. The risk of an FIV-positive cat spreading the virus to an FIV-negative cat can be minimized by putting the new cat in a separate rooms until you are confident that they will not fight with each other using the slow-introduction process.

Can FIV-positive cats have a good and long life? Yes, FIV-positive cats can live normal lives, both in quality and duration. They just need to be INDOOR ONLY cats, monitored for infections and dental issues. But if they're well cared for, they can be healthy, happy, wonderful pets. Feed a good healthy diet, (not raw due to immunity issues with uncooked meat and eggs) an immunity boosting supplement and check-ups twice per year at the vet.

The Monroe County Animal Shelter is located at 170 Kefauver Lane in Madisonville (behind Wal-Mart) and is open Tuesday – Friday from 11 – 4:30 and Saturdays from 11 – 2.
