LIFT STATION MAINTENANCE

You may have recently noticed a large number of workers at the sewer lift station near the intersection of Tellico Parkway and Davis Ferry Rd and may have wondered why so many trucks and people are necessary. Normally, most repair and maintenance of the sewer lift stations can be done with a team of 2-3 people, including a mix of TVPOA personnel and contractors. However, this changes dramatically whenever a person must physically enter the wet-well.

The sewer wet-wells are confined spaces and are very hazardous. Both US and Tennessee OSHA have strict rules that regulate who can enter the well, how long they can remain in, and who else needs to be onsite. Before work can begin, the well must be emptied and washed down. A vacuum truck provides this service. The POA has a standing contract with Roto-Rooter for routine and emergency vacuum services. Next, a trailer mounted bypass pump must be delivered and installed to keep the station functioning while we're working on it.

In order for one person to enter the well a team of three must be present. One person enters the well, one person is on standby to rescue the worker should something go wrong, and a superintendent directs the work and monitors air quality in the well. While all this is ongoing, POA personnel need to be onsite to provide access, operate valves, and direct the contractors.

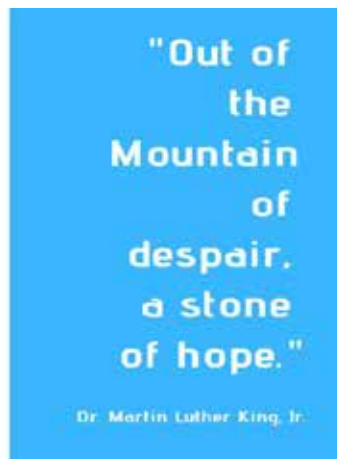

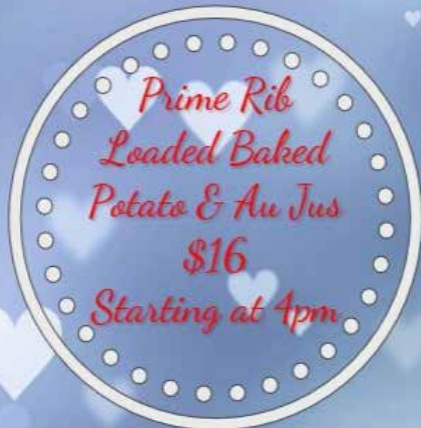
